Yesterday, I attended a wonderful lecture at the Western Heritage Center in downtown Billings. The topic was the rule of community cookbooks in telling the story of women in Billings history. It was fascinating to see how church cookbooks play a big role in the telling of women's history and because of that in telling the history of the whole community. Being published and printed is a real sign of privilege in any society, being published and printed in a small frontier community is a real rarity. We learned about a church cookbook from the early 1900's and what it told about people with power and people pushed aside in our community. There were great stories of how meals and menus could lead to radical inclusion in places that polite society might blush about. "Those people at that table?!"



I'm still thinking today about the power and privilege we have at American Lutheran Church now to day. With our history, steady presence, influence, and large sturdy stature at the corner of Division and Lewis, we have a role to play in the

community of Billings. We are thankful for the work of the On Our Way committee for the ways they are tending to our physical presence and our financial benevolence that can impact so many. We are grateful for the work of the RIC committee that is helping us use our privilege as a means of welcome and invitation instead of exclusion.

Music, Music, Music


