I What is Vision? - Vision – Hebrew - Strong's Concordance number 2377 and comes from # 2372

Transliteration- ḥāzôn- Pronunciation- khaw-zone' - The KJV translates Strong's H2377 in the

following manner: vision (35x) - The KJV translates Strong's H2372 châzâh, khaw-zaw in the following manner: see (38x), behold (7x), look (3x), prophesy (2x), provide (1x).

A "Chazaw" Vision

Without a Spiritual "Chawzaw" vision, a New Year's resolution becomes a goal we will begin and may or may not accomplish. And more often than not, these goals and resolutions are never completed. A "Chawzaw" vision is not something we want to accomplish; rather, it is an experience that awakens something inside us that becomes a part of our internal being. This vision is the light from heaven that awakens us and opens our eyes to see what the LORD God, our creator, purposed when he created us. Therefore, it puts a burden on us, a heart cry inside us that drives us to move forward to its fulfillment.

II How to receive your "Chazaw" vision for 2022

Receiving one's "chazaw" vision takes a process. It does not just happen in an instant. No, it requires a reflection that develops a series of questions about our past, future, and present. This makes sense when we consider what a "chazaw" vision is. It is an eternal calling from God himself. Knowing God is eternal and has no past, present, or future, just "now," we understand our "Chazaw" vision has always been, is, and will always be. Therefore, all the steps I have learned to walk into my "Chazaw" vision always begin with me removing all distractions of the world around me and my fleshly thoughts and concepts.

Step one: Believe! – 1) God is a sovereign creator – You were created for a purpose Ephesians 1:11 & 2:10


2) The blood of JESUS – Your crucified and resurrected savior – restores you to your original purpose – this is your "Chazaw" vision -

Step Two – Remove Distractions – shut down all voices other than the truth of God's Word and Spirit. This includes the voices of media, others around you, and the voices of your inner dialogue.

Step Three - Reflect- Ask probing questions about your past, present, and future.

Step Four – Listen and look – The questions of step three open your mind and spirit to the light of God's love and truth for you.

The questions must probe all three areas of your past, present, and future.



A goal or a New Year's resolution can come from and affect one or at least two of these areas. However, since a "Chazone" vision comes from the eternal spiritual realm, it will come from and affect all three realms simultaneously. This is the only way it can not only be something you desire to do, but it becomes a part of you. It begins to define you.

Example Questions

Here are some thoughts and questions you can meditate on and pray about to help you begin to see your "Chazaw" vision. After you have read through them, I urge you to pray about them, take a sheet of paper, and write out your thoughts and the things Holy Spirit brings to your mind. This will help you to formulate your "Chazaw" vision and then break it down into goals and strategies.

PAST:

Do I see my past as God redeeming my decisions and preparing me for my call and purpose?

Do I see my past as a series of events that just happened to me, coming from luck, favor, or abuse?

Is my past something that holds me back from doing what I feel could be God's will for me, or is it something God is using to prepare me for my future?

When I think about my past, what feeling arises?

Am I looking forward to God's plan for the new year, or do I see it as a repeat of what the last year held?

What things last year gave me joy and excitement?

What things frustrated me most?

When I think about last year, do I feel a sense of growth and gratitude for God's grace, or do I feel a sense of failure and shame?

Do you find yourself remembering and rehearsing things from your past and wishing things were different? If so, what events and why?

PRESENT

List three things you are passionate about.

List three things in the world around you that frustrate you.

List three <u>seemingly impossible</u> things that you would like to do.

What relationship in your life would you like to see grow this year?

Have you written a discipleship plan for this year that lists goals and strategies for the next year?

FUTURE

What is something you have always thought about doing but never acted on?

What gifts or talents do you feel the LORD wants to develop in you?

How do you feel your family and friends describe you – (some examples are- quiet, outgoing, task-oriented, a people person)?

What do you feel you see in the world around you that you have to offer? And what would that be?

These are only example questions to help you start evaluating and preparing for God's "Chazaw" vision for you. Once again, I urge you to begin writing your thoughts and meditations (Hab. 2:2) as the Lord leads you. As we go forward in fasting and consecration for this year, the Lord will develop his "Chazaw" vision in you. Below, I have laid out the essential elements and effects of the "Chazaw" vision.
