Parish Survey

March-April. 2019

WHAT WAS THE SURVEY?

- Hartford Religious Research Institute, a part of the Hartford Seminary, Hartford, CT
- 185 survey emails were sent to parishioners
- 135 responses were received (73%)
- 90 of the 135 were complete (67%)

- 89% of us are over 65 years old; 56% are over 75.
- 50% of us were raised Episcopalian.
- 22% of us were raised Roman Catholic.
- 67% are married; 18% are widows/widowers.
- We have 2 members under the age of 20; we had NO respondents between 20 & 45 yrs. old.
- We are 98% Caucasian.

- 65% have a college degree (40% = post-graduate).
- 91% of us are retired.
- 63% have income over \$75,000; 47% have income over \$100,000.

- 82% live within a 15 minute drive of Good Shepherd.
- 84% have lived in the area 5 or more years;
 63% have lived in the area 10 years or more.
- 70% are couples living without children.
- We are very similar to our neighbors living within a 5 mile radius.

- Good Shepherd attracted us because of its Episcopal denomination, its worship style and its priest.
- 56% of us have been a member of Good Shepherd for less than 10 years; 42% for 10 yrs. or more.
- We are volunteers! More than 70% of us are involved in two or more church ministries; 40% are involved in 4 or more!

- We try to be one big family, primarily oriented toward serving each other.
- We support each other in times of need.
- Members are encouraged to discover their unique gifts for ministry and service; and have equal opportunity to take on leadership roles.
- Our leaders keep us informed.

- Like any family, we have our spats...and we haven't always been very good at resolving our conflicts.
- We haven't been encouraged to try something new.
- We insulate ourselves from other churches and the surrounding community.
- We disagree about whether or not our morale is good.

- We believe in our Anglican identity and heritage.
- We work through our Episcopal Diocese.
- We don't consider ourselves to be a prestigious or status church.
- We're comfortable with our congregation's identity.
- We believe our facilities meet our needs and are satisfied with the church's condition and aesthetics.

- We offer Godly, traditional Christian worship.
- We provide fellowship, pastoral care and charity to the needy in our community and the world.
- We share in the Good News of Jesus Christ.
- We see ourselves on a journey to salvation through the grace of our savior, Jesus Christ.

WHAT DO WE PREFER?

- We like our worship services being at 8am &10am.
- We prefer using Rite I at 8am and Rite II at 10am.
- We love our Anglican musical traditions, but would also like to see more "contemporary" songs.
- We love a good sermon from a great preacher.
- But we'd just as soon forego the incense, thank you!

WHERE SHOULD WE PUT MORE EMPHASIS?

- 57% would like to see us provide more Christian education for children and youth.
- 45% say we should participate more in activities and programs with other local religious groups.
- 32% want to do more to bring the good news of the Gospel to the unchurched.
- 28% feel we should do more to help members discover // their own gifts for ministry and service.

WHERE CAN WE IMPROVE?

- 15% want to help members deepen their personal, spiritual relationship with God.
- 15% want to provide better Christian education for children and youth.
- 13% want to provide worship that expresses the Gospel in contemporary language and forms.
- 12% want to help members discover their own gifts for ministry and service.
- No other suggested improvement topped 10%.

WHAT DO WE WANT IN A PRIEST?

- 99% want a preacher who gives inspiring sermons.
- 93% want a priest who plans & leads a worship service that is sensitive to the needs of the parish.
- 86% want a priest who emphasizes the spiritual needs of the parishioners.
- 84% want a priest who involves the laity in planning and leading events and programs.
- 82% want a priest who visits the sick, the shut-ins and the bereaved.

WE WANT A PRIEST WHO:

- Emphasizes spiritual development vs. a Biblical scholar.
- Emphasizes the Bible vs. contemporary issues.
- Prefers to try new ways vs. the same old thing.
- Encourages laity leaders vs. makes the decisions.
- Has a relaxed vs. formal interpersonal style.
- Aligns goals to budget vs. "Do it!" (and worry about the cost later).

WE WANT A PRIEST WHO:

- Is a strong Celebrant/preacher, at home leading the congregation in worship...vs. a social activist or evangelist.
- Is a gifted teacher committed to Christian formation.
- Is a spiritual guide with an exemplary spiritual life.
- Is outgoing and sociable... vs. reserved and reflective.

WHAT QUALITIES DO WE MOST WANT IN OUR NEW RECTOR?

The Three Most Important Qualities:

- 1. An effective preacher/speaker.
- 2. A compassionate and caring person.
- 3. A priest who encourages people to relate their faith to their daily lives.

WHAT QUALITIES DO WE MOST WANT IN OUR NEW RECTOR?


The Next Three Most Important Qualities:

- 4. A mature, emotionally secure person.
- 5. Someone who builds fellowship among the people with whom he/she works.
- 6. A good leader.

WHAT QUALITIES DO WE MOST WANT IN OUR NEW RECTOR?

The Third 3 Important Qualities:

- 7. A pastor who calls on people in hospitals, nursing homes and those confined to home.
- 8. A person who deals effectively with conflict.
- 9. Someone who encourages others to assume and carry out leadership.

WHAT DO WE WANT OUR NEXT RECTOR TO KNOW ABOUT THE FUTURE AT GOOD SHEPHERD?



CHILDREN AND YOUTH


- We would ALL be happy to have more children and youth.
- But we MUST be realistic!
 - We tried this with Father John... but we failed to keep young families after he left.
 - Traditional denominations are not attracting young families.
 - Those young families that attend church are most often attracted to evangelical, non-traditional churches.
- We need to understand who we are and how we fit into God's plan. Where can we do the most good?

WHAT WILL OUR MISSION BE?

- 50 members (45%) say we should participate more in activities and programs with other local religious groups.
- 36 members (32%) want to do more to bring the good news of the Gospel to the unchurched.

WHAT WILL OUR MISSION BE?

- Are we called to a mission of Christian Renewal?
- As people in our age range move into the area in their retirement, might they be ready to re-engage with God?
- Can we seek to reach out to the unchurched in our midst?
- Can we connect with them and welcome them into a fellowship of Holy Communion?
- Are we called to reconcile our brothers and sisters to God and Jesus Christ?
