# **Moment's Reflection**

"We have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God." -2 Corinthians 4:7

(Note: Dr. Dan, made the following presentation to the DWM groups this month based on 2 Corinthians 4-6. Below is a portion of that presentation).

How do we grade a Christian? How do we know if a Christian is being a Christian?

In school, for instance, we give grades. Other times, we post reviews on social media. Or we look at a person's credentials. His or her education, training. Or we evaluate how well a person completes his job description.

But what about a Christian? How is a Christian evaluated? Do we carry a job description? Such as: "A Christian shall accept the responsibility of serving Jesus a minimum of 12 hours a week. Half of these hours must be direct contact. A Christian will memorize the Great Commission. In addition, a Christian will be required to complete 6 hours of continuing education to include some of the following: Bible Study, DWM meetings, participation in extracurricular activities such as bells, choir, or committee volunteerism.

Or do we submit a resume? Such as: "A Christian will have completed two years of bible

study and/or attendance in worship. A Christian will be fluent in: Greek, Hebrew, or English language theology. Bilingual a plus, but not required."

Or do we let everyone know our accomplishments. Like Paul, for instance, who wrote to the Philippians: "...If anyone else has reason to be confident in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, a member of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless."

In his second letter to the Corinthians, Paul outlines a different way. Check out the 8 criterion he teaches.

"Since your job credentials are identical, we'll play musical chairs."

1. Our ministry changes lives. (2 Corinthians 3:2) You want to know a good teacher, look at her students.

2. God makes us competent. "Our competence is from God." (2 Corinthians 3:5)

3. We speak with sincerity. Even though we know our words may be rejected, we keep speaking the truth (2 Corinthians 2:17) And? We don't hold secrets (2 Corinthians 4: 2).

4. We spread the "aroma of Christ" wherever we go (2 Corinthians 2:14-15).

5. We preach salvation, not condemnation. We speak a Gospel! (2 Corinthians 3:9).

6. God approves of us! Minter writes: "I care what people think, but I'm more concerned with what God thinks."

7. We are strongest when we are weak (2 Corinthians 4:7)

8. We keep perspective. We don't focus on momentary afflictions. We keep our focus on "an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure." (2 Corinthians 4:17)



# Choir Director Stan McGill honored for 40 years of service

In a very special service on October 30th, we celebrated Stan McGill's 40th anniversary as the chancel choir director of First Christian Church of Garland. The Chancel Choir sang a piece commissioned in his honor, composed by Joseph Martin titled *"Your Place in the Song"*.

In his words, Pastor Dan said of Stan, "Years ago when I began here, I don't think I knew quite what I had. I was used to affable choir directors for whom I was simply glad to have some ability, some inclination to read the keys. I had never worked alongside a maestro. When I think about some of the most memorable and moving and beautiful services I've been a part of through the years, Stan has always been a part of those. He's been the one who's been there to provide the music that makes the meaning of the moment. And in those moments because of his music, I have worshipped alongside with the congregation. Never been disappointed: Christmas Eve, Easter Morning, Maundy Thursday, Ash Wednesday, All Saints, dedications of every variety. He has been the music mind behind the services that have given expression to the meaning of the church's year. I'm probably missing something, but a preponderance of years of evidence is clear our church has had some of the finest musical worship that you'll find. One of the church's living saints told me that Stan has mellowed over the years. He said some of us long-timers remember when Stan began all those years ago, he expected perfection and would sometimes get impatient with us average singers who occasionally missed a note. But over the years, he's mellowed. He's learned to pursue

musical excellence while having the grace to accept what we have to offer. In my book, this is excellence refined. Excellence married to loving regard for the people whom he has been called to lead. Today we take time and as much as I want to laud Stan's musical genius, I speak for a grateful congregation in saying thank you for all the many years."

We also presented him with this beautiful painting from our good friend Mark Mullino, which incorporated the music of the commissioned piece with a depiction of our church. Thank you Stan for all you do!




## Mike's Kids
