ATONEMENT LUTHERAN CHURCH ENDOWMENT TRUST

The Trustees wanted to let our congregation aware of who received the funds for 2024. We were able to give a *Charitable Gift* of \$3,500. To three different outreach programs.

- 1. Skyview High School Teen Pantry \$1,166.66
- 2. Castle Rock Middle School Pantry \$1,166.66
- 3. Medicine Crow Middle School Teen Pantry \$1,166.66

Thank you, Atonement Lutheran Church congregation, for your genius gifts to our Endowment Trust. You are making a difference in our community in which we all live in.

At this time most people have completed their income taxes for last year, and now we want to consider tax ideas for next year.

The State of Montana has made a change for 2024 for gifting to a Charitable Endowment which Atonement Lutheran Church Endowment Trust qualifies for.

Montana taxpayers can reduce or eliminate your state income taxes up to \$15,000. Gifts must be made to a qualified endowment to capture the tax credit. This transaction needs to be made before 12-31-2024 and work with our Trustees to complete paperwork.

Another tax idea is on your IRA Required Minimum Distributions (RMD's). The Qualified Charitable Distribution is available to all IRA owners over 701/2 or 73. The amount rolled over satisfies the IRA owner's RMD and is not included in the donor's adjusted gross income.

We would suggest you discuss this with your tax preparer or CPA as everyone's taxes are different.

FAMILY PROMISE

Starting in 2004, Atonement Lutheran became a charter member of Family Promise of Yellowstone County. Back then local churches and the synagogue came together as a network to work on the issue of inadequate housing for families with children and were known as Interfaith Hospitality Network. (See the metal sign outside of the main kitchen door, IHN.) For twenty years we have served homeless families, and by blessing them, we ourselves have been blessed. The average age of the people who we work with in Family Promise is 9 years of age!! 80% of the adults have jobs when they come to FP. Our recent families became homeless because of a mobile home park being sold and the owners planning to build housing; a family who had two incomes lost one of the people earning money and the housing cost was not doable with only one income; another had rent increased at an apartment and income was not enough to cover the costs. These people have been living in cars, in rundown motels, and with others with questionable safety for all involved. FP helps families who do not currently have housing and are working with the staff at FP to become financially

independent. Families who have worked with FP have had extraordinary success over the years at getting secure housing and active employment after their intense efforts to change their lives. They have an over 90% success rate with stable housing 5 years after completing the program. This past year we have been hosting more often as we work with getting more churches in the community active with FP and hosting themselves. We appreciate all the work that ALC volunteers have given as we continue to support these deserving parents and children. ALC is on the calendar to host the families June 16-22 and hope you will prayerfully consider how you can be a part of this important ministry.


Prayer Shawl Ministry AKA Stitches and Scriptures
