On Sunday July 14<sup>th</sup> during service, there will be a blessing and send off for the Atonement group attending the ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans the 16<sup>th</sup> to the 20<sup>th</sup>. Please come bless our group and give them a warm send off. Then join them on July 28<sup>th</sup> during service to hear them present their experience and share photos and memories from their time at the gathering.

On Sunday **July 7**<sup>th</sup> and **14**<sup>th</sup> during service, Atonement youth will be accepting donations to take with them to New Orleans to give as their special offering to Generation Zero-Hunger. This special offering will go to the ELCA World Hunger's Generation Zero-Hunger which is a youth-driven fundraising challenge to support the programs of ELCA World Hunger, our church's ministry to end hunger and poverty. Many groups will bring their offerings to the <u>ELCA Youth Gathering</u> in New Orleans. Below are some examples of how different donation amounts can be used to change the lives of those receiving these donations:

- **\$50 could provide a community with five fruit-tree seedlings.** These low-maintenance trees are an investment in the community that can span generations, protecting the soil from erosion and providing nutritious fruit to children and adults alike.
- **\$50 can help a farmer grow!** With new tools, seeds and agricultural training, a family can start their own small garden, improve their daily nutrition and increase their earning power.
- \$100 can feed 50 people through a variety of feeding ministries, connecting guests to the resources they need.
- \$500 can provide a family with a cow, which can produce as many as 3 gallons of nutritious, calcium-packed milk. That milk can also be used to make cheese, yogurt, butter and other dairy products to eat and sell for a steady source of income.
- **\$500 empowers four women to build a new business** weaving, baking or running a storefront, for example that creates a steady source of income and helps their families escape poverty.
- **\$2,500 can provide water for as many as 500 families.** With a simple water well, spring box or other water point, communities gain access to clean, safe water. People spend less money on medical expenses and more on food and education. And instead of spending hours each day gathering water for the family, women and children have time for work and school.



#### FINANCE COMMITTEE

It's time for an almost mid-year financial update on the ministry year 2024.

Here's the good news. Our general offerings are up over 18% over the prior year. Our total giving is incredible. What's more, our general attendance numbers are up 20% over last year too. We are growing in Christ together.

Here's the challenge. You may remember that council constructed a 2024 budget based on the ask that congregants split their offerings 90/10. That is to say, 90 percent to the General fund and 10 percent to the Building fund. As a congregation we agreed and approved this budget. We are therefore all collectively responsible for it.

As a reminder, our building funds supports paying our mortgage only. The General fund (ie. Ministry Fund) supports literally everything else at church — our worship ministries, pastoral ministries, youth and children ministries, VBS, Bible studies, visitations, our social outreach ministries (Family Promise, Teen Pantry, 2nd Sandwich Sundays etc), and administration.

At this moment, we are seeing that folks are still splitting their giving 80/20. What this means is that our building fund is running a surplus and our ministry fund is running a deficit. What we are asking for at this time is that you strongly consider reallocating your giving to reflect 90/10 model that best equips our congregation to do powerful ministry and continue to grow in Christ together! Or since we are around the mid-point of the year, feel encouraged to split 95/5.

For those of us who give online or who write physical check, it's a simple adjustment. If you need any assistance in making changes to your offerings, feel encouraged to contact our administrator during office hours (Monday-Thursday 8:30-2:30pm; Friday by appointment).
