The year 1976 was probably the most significant year in our lives. The Holy Spirit began to tug on our hearts and in February of that year Karin received Salvation with Larry following on the March 21.....It seemed as though our time had come and from very shortly after Salvation we were both working in the church, teaching and part of the worship team.

We never felt like strangers, it was more like we felt like we had come home and have never turned back. Life was busy raising a family and working, but God had instilled a purpose in us and our 2nd home became the Church.

During the next few years we both worked in Youth Ministry, as Youth Pastors in our home church and as Sectional Youth leaders in our Section. During this time, in 1981, we lost our youngest son in a car accident. Yes, it rocked our lives and tested our faith...God is so faithful and with His arms of love and healing, He was the rudder that directed out lives... In 1984 we started a church in Aberdeen with us and our 3 boys.....soon word got out and as the church grew, believe me, we very quickly grew as well. The Lord is ever mindful of His own and knows us better than we know ourselves.... Through service to others our healing began and can testify.....there is no pain He cannot heal, no need He will not supply, no emptiness He will not fill....".He is Jehovah...the God that healeth thee".....

After seven years we stepped down from Pastoring and raised the boys, worked jobs and continued to grow and heal and learn.....

In 1999 we began visiting different Pastors on Sunday mornings......building relationships and encouragement...We often filled the Pulpit for them and if there was a church in the section without a Pastor, we would step in and fill any need there might be. Yes, more healing and growth.

Larry retired end of May 2007, 43yrs after he began at Weyerhaeuser. Our intention was, we felt, to continue to visit the Pastors and fill in and help in any way we could.

In July we were asked to fill the pulpit in the Olympia church as the Pastors were taking the month off. We did, and thus, here we are, in our 17th year.....in Olympia....

We celebrated our 50th wedding anniversary in 2020 and are looking for to our 55th in 2025.

Yes, 1976 was a good year......

District Youth Director Report The last 3 months

Let me start out by saying that this seems to be one of the most productive quarters in the last year or so. Dave and I have been working on a new initiative for the PNW PCG youth that excites me. We are headed in a good direction.

In November I attended our national board meetings in Dallas. At that meeting we talked about new initiatives nationally to get youth involved with missions, which is one of the 4 main initiatives we have as a district. I'm actually sending my daughter on a mission trip again this year with the national PCG trip to Mexico. With this new drive and initiative for missions, I talked to Thomas Vigil from our church in Hayden who is leading trips to Africa. He is willing and wanting to set up trips for people to come with him hopefully in 2025 as well. I visited Worship Center in Smelterville December 1st and we discussed the new energy and vision going forward which excited them. We talked about the possibility of adding to the mission trip they are taking to South America in August possibly as well. Ed was also really excited about the possibility of us doing teen talent expo again. He is back into leading the youth program in his church again and is excited to see some new things to work towards.

On the topic of camp, I also talked with Ed and Thomas about the upcoming winter retreats in January and February for High School and Jr high youth. We brought Ed and his wife Ashley on board as seasonal staff at camp ALACCA last year where they lead the discipleship of the high school and college interns. Ed has also been speaking at our camps the last two years. Coming up in February he will be a speaker for our Jr High retreat. For our High School retreat we have Randy Pool who's family was a part of PCG in the past, he is now a part of the Assembly of God and is a missionary through them headed to Malaysia in the fall of 2025. Our High School retreat is January 17-19 and our Jr High retreat is February 7-9.

As far as summer camps go, we cover all ages from 2nd grade to 12th grade.

High School Camp June 23-27

Jr High Camp July 7-11

4,5,6 grades July 14-18

2,3,4 grades July 21-25

We are still seeking a speaker for High School summer camp and 2,3,4 Summer camp but I have Mark Shaufler speaking at the Jr High and 4,5,6 camps. Mark is a charismatic independent pastor and missionary from western Washington. He's been in our leadership trainings and groups when we were going to Olympia with Dwayne Deskins years ago, not tied to PCG but to Dave Minton. I tried to get Randy Lawerance on this summer too but his schedule in the summer is really hard for us to get into. I say all this to help reassure you that even though ALACCA is a non-denominational camp that does not teach specifics on things like tongues, prophecy, women pastors, etc., it doesn't teach away from those things either. We do our best to put the focus on what matters most and that's Christ and Christ crucified. In that alone we have plenty to teach and practice for a lifetime. We let the church's that the students go back home to do the other parts. Our goal is unity in love and the gospel. This year's theme is Pursuit. The idea of this theme is to inspire the students to press in hard on the pursuit of knowing and being with God. A moment in the pursuit of him is a moment in the presence of him. A good representation might be how a hound dog pursues a mountain lion. It's what he's made to do, trained to do, and desires nothing more than to do the pursuit. Do we pursue God like this? We hope to inspire the students to do so. So, I want to encourage you to promote camp to your students.

Another thing to promote within the camp theme is our discipleship program. We hire 12 college age interns and pay them around \$800 for 8 weeks of their summer while we disciple them and use them to lead our cabins with a High School intern that they disciple for 3 of the weeks. They learn how to share the gospel through their testimony and lead cabin chats in the cabins with the campers as well. The other internship that we do is for the High School age student. They come to their camp at the end of June and then they come to the camps to follow Monday-Saturday for 3 weeks as they help their college intern lead. They also get discipled by their college intern and our internship leaders (Ed and Ashley) for those 3 weeks. For more information, please visit the alacca.org website or get a hold of me.

That covers all but one other initiative that we've been looking to start. The last one is going to take some time and is a little lower on the priority for me at this point but still seeking for the interest anyway. Bible Quizzing is something that is really good for the churches that may have a group of kids that they want to dive deep into memorization and competition. Hopefully we will get to that stage in the next couple years but I'm not sure we have any that are there yet. Johny Schuster
