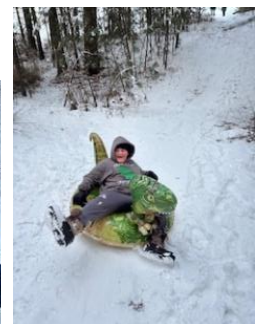

Sledding day at Bishop's (Grandpa's) house for the Grandkids!

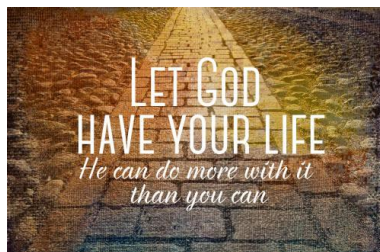




Simply an amazing testimony and praise report we requested from Pastor Steven Hemming of Hayden Family Worship Center.

One of our Sunday School teachers, who has been so faithful and loyal in teaching and instructing the children about Jesus for many years at our church, has a grandson born with a kidney disease. We (FWC) all remember fervently interceding for him as the report of the doctor said the chances of him surviving were slim to none. The boy not only survived but overcame as he began to get older and stronger, Liam would have to battle with this kidney disease and diagnoses his entire life. During the Covid epidemic and at the Ronald McDonald house in Seattle, WA, the family was informed that the boy wouldn't be able to stay there during the surgery due to not being vaccinated. So, the Church did a fundraiser for Liam's family to support them financially while they had to stay in Seattle for approximately 3-4 months. By God's grace over \$30,000 was generated! There at the fundraiser, the grandmother Nita was telling me that all they need now is a donor. That's when I asked what it takes to be a donor. She asked me what blood type I was. I told her that I did not know. So, I went to give blood to find out my blood type. Come to find out, I am the same blood type as the boy. From that time forward, doors opened with ease as God was making it evidently clear that I was to give this boy my kidney. Going to Seattle and processing through a gamut of testing and coming to realize that I was not only a blood match, but a tissue match in along with other standards and qualifications that I passed with ease. The surgery took place Jan. 7, 2026. A week later when they tested Liam's kidney function and creatine levels, he was far surpassing any of their expectations. He has 100% kidney function and his creatine level is lower than one, which is really good. This boy is a miracle and what a privilege that it is to be an answer to prayer. I thank the Lord Jesus Christ that because of his victory on the cross, disarming the devil and rendering him powerless, crushing sins dominion over our lives, we get to now fight from that place of victory and live for the benefit of others showing forth the praises of him who has called us out of darkness into His marvelous light. No matter if it's one soul, one family, or one congregation to be an extension of God's love and kindness, and tender mercy is what it's all about.

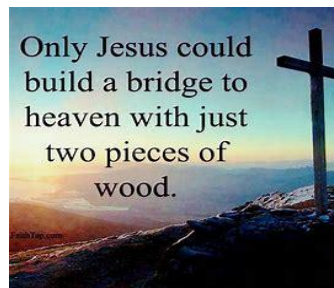

SO...

Matthew 19:26 (AMP)

26 But Jesus looked at them and said, “With people [as far as it depends on them] it is impossible, but with God all things are possible.”

The state of our Nation is deeply concerning to many as well as myself. Recently I had to address a situation with a company regarding employees and social media posts. One of Facebook's capabilities is to monitor and track a person's interest and upon this deliver news feed's that fit their algorithm, these algorithms reinforce their biases which in turn can polarize oneself from really seeking the truth, we become so narrow minded that we can see thru a keyhole with both eyes wide open! I'm not talking about compromising any convictions here, or being weak in the faith, or hiding in fear. I'm talking about falling prey to pride and self-righteousness. In my experience these certain algorithms are limited in view so the danger is responding to and voicing opinions based on such (it's not the full view). My question to us in the PNW is, does this help or hurt our cause? Our adversary is working hard to divide our Nation and if we are not careful, we can play into the devil's hand and suffer from strife and division ourselves. 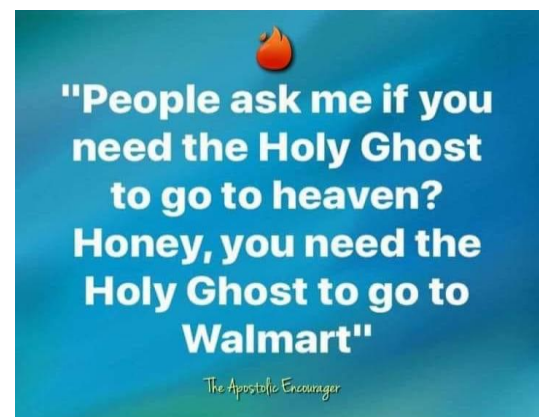
