FAITH FORMATION

Hello again! Coaches, let's huddle up and discuss the other two verses in chapter 9 of First Corinthians we were considering two weeks ago. So you and I were brainstorming on how we could help our star players, our children, be the best spiritual athletes they can be and really help them win **THE BIG PRIZE: HEAVEN!** We have to be as coaches good models of spiritual fitness ourselves, and we have to be comfortable pushing them spiritually from time to time because we are coaches, and coaches want winners! Let's continue on in our reading and see how the Holy Spirit can help us be great coaches.

That is why I run straight for the finish line; that is why I am like a boxer who does not waste his punches. (vs. 26) How straight are your youth running? A coach is *always* paying attention to their players. Are you distracted spiritually by the things of the world? Do television, sports, or other forms of entertainment, although good in themselves, distract you from the focus you should have on your children? Do you go running together spiritually, such as setting aside some time during the week to go to adoration as a family? What do you do when your youth choose poor decisions in associations, entertainment, or spiritual priorities? If a runner starts to go off the track, the winning coach is right there, waking the runner up, providing encouragement to get back on the right course, and accompanying them to the finish line. Remember, the trust your children have in your spiritual guidance will be what helps them listen and follow your advice. Our children are in the greatest spiritual fight of their lives, they cannot afford to waste their punches, meaning just going through the motions. When they pray, they have to be engaged, when they go to Mass, they have to be engaged, when they read the Bible, they have to be engaged. In each case they have to pay attention. Don't let your youth walk around during Mass. Don't let them use their cell phone when they should be worshipping. Don't let them become idle during family prayer. Make each spiritual punch count in knocking out the Devil.

I harden my body with blows and bring it under complete control, to keep myself from being disqualified after having called others to the contest. (vs. 27) Runners, boxers, and others spend much time working out, and their bodies reflect that exercise. Our youth can't be flabby spiritually speaking. They won't develop a winning body by hitting the gym every so often. Athletes push themselves to be the best. Coaches are the key to helping the athlete develop properly. How many olympic gymnasts won the gold medal without a coach? No matter how much spiritual talent your children possess, YOU are the factor that help them achieve greatness. Behind every winning athlete there is a winning coach. Don't give up!

In many sports today it is customary to reward everyone for taking part. Not so in the race for life. It is a fight that has only one outcome, life or death. (Deuteronomy 30:15) We are all in this spiritual struggle together. We are all on one team. You may be reading this feeling like you aren't sure how to be a good coach to your children. We offer parent meetings during religious education on Sundays at 9:15. We discuss how to build our faith up, and how can we help our children. You are always invited to attend. We have groups in English and Spanish. Our parish family is united in winning against Satan and gaining the prize of Heaven!

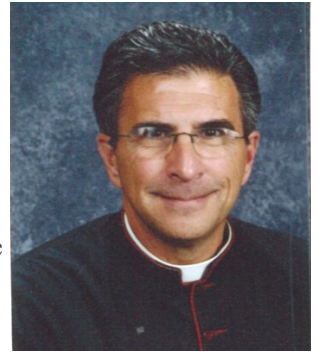
