# **FAITH FORMATION**

Hello Parents!

Last time we were discussing our mission as Catholics, as disciples: young, old, and in between. In fact, every time our family leaves Mass at St Anthony's we are reminded by the words hanging over each exit that say: **now entering missionary territory**. The WORLD is our mission. starting with ourselves, our families, and then everyone that we encounter.

Jesus provided us with the Catholic mission statement: "Go, then, to all peoples everywhere and make them my disciples; baptize them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and teach them to obey everything I have commanded you. And I will be with you always, to the end of the age." (Matt 28:19, 20) This harmonizes well with what we have chosen as a St Anthony's family for our parish mission statement. See the website!

He says, GO, then, to all peoples everywhere. Is that something we are doing, being willing to GO? It's easy to say, "Well, I go to Mass." Terrific! But that isn't the going he was talking about. Mass is our practice for this work. Which is why it's a grave sin when we miss Mass without just cause. (and just so you know, softball, baseball, and soccer games are NOT just cause - God still expects you to be in His house. It's ok to come in your jersey if you have to! Leave your bat in the car, please) It's not only as our divine coach that He wants to be with us and be close to us. He wants us to practice what He's teaching us while we are in His house: how to talk to Him (The Lord's Prayer), being humble about our faults and sins to Him and others (I confess), being peaceful with our teammates (the sign of peace), and realizing He wants everyone to be a part of His team (Eucharist). When we miss practice (Mass) we are benched (grave sin) until we get back on the team (Reconciliation).

So, how do we make disciples, starting with ourselves and our children? What were the commandments that Jesus has (hopefully) taught us to obey? Mark 12: 30, 31 tell us: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second most important commandment is this: 'Love your neighbor as you love yourself.' There is no other commandment more important than these two." How can we LOVE God if we don't KNOW Him? If we aren't praying individually or as a family we might be able to say we know ABOUT Him and yet don't KNOW Him. So how do we get to know Him? By daily prayer, reading His word the Bible together, spending time together in adoration, so we can hear him by being still and listening in the silence. Looking for Him in other people, creation, and the events of each day. Try using the daily examen by St Ignatius at the end of each day for help in listening to and seeing God in your everyday life. Ask me for a card if you're interested. How about His church? How much do you and your family love about your faith? There are several Catechisms available to you, from the easy to read Youcat for youth and young at heart, to the US Catechism for Adults, to the lengthy and more comprehensive Roman Catechism of the Catholic Church. Make it your goal to read one of these in the next year. We offer many opportunities at St Anthony's for parent studies, youth studies and groups, and religious education classes. Be present at them! Next time: Loving our neighbors or loving ourselves? See you then, and get ready to GO!







Thanks to the folks from Christ the King parish. It was great to be together again, around the Eucharistic presence.


We were honored to have the bishop here with us to lead us in prayer.
