

Hello Parents!

I have to say personally in my life before being drawn to the Catholic faith I never had done any volunteer work or assistance to my community. The 30 plus years I spent as Jehovah's Witness I never once performed a helpful act to others beyond visiting them with the Watchtower magazine. I have a lot of time to make up for. I am thrilled to be working with each confirmation class as we discuss their mission in life and being part of the choices that they make. Each class picks an activity they feel called as a group to perform to benefit their fellow man,or cat, when we volunteered at Furry Friends Refuge. Let's all go as a parish family and become known in the community for the love and faith we display to our neighbors. All of us, including our children.

St Paul wrote to Timothy these words some 2000 years ago: "I solemnly urge you to preach the message, to insist upon proclaiming it (whether the time is right or not)" (2 Tim 4:1a,2a) It was urgent in his time and it is so much more urgent now. People NEED the education, compassion, and healing that the Gospel message and love in action can give them. The Catholic Church every day feeds more people, clothes more people, educates more people, takes care of the sick and imprisoned, more than ANY OTHER ORGANIZATION ON THE PLANET. What part are you and your family having in this work? Are you participating or not? St John encourages us: "let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth." (1 John 3:18) We can't just talk about how we should do this work....we actually have to DO IT. St James really is direct when he speaks to us with these words: "My friends, what good is it for one of you to say that you have faith if your actions do not prove it? Can that faith save you? Suppose there are brothers or sisters who need clothes and don't have enough to eat. What good is there in your saying to them, "God bless you! Keep warm and eat well!"—if you don't give them the necessities of life? So it is with faith: if it is alone and includes no actions, then it is dead." (James 2:14-17) If we aren't participating in the mission of the Church to help others, our faith, and quite possibly, our families' faith, IS DEAD! This is serious! All mankind are our brothers and sisters and they need us.

God WILL accomplish His mission - He could even let stones do all the work. (Luke 19:40) But He desires each of us to partner with Him - the God who created everyone and everything has personally chosen YOU and YOUR FAMILY to help HIM change the WORLD.. 


