FAITH FORMATION

Hello Parents! Today we are going to look deep into the book of Nehemiah in the Bible. It starts on page 545 of the parish Bible in English. The Israelites had been unfaithful to God for many years, and after sending prophets time and again to try to bring the people back to true worship, He allowed Jerusalem to be destroyed and the people to be carried off to Babylon for 70 years of captivity. He moved events after the 70 years had passed so that the people who had now made a conversion of heart would be restored to their homeland. The book opens with Nehemiah in Babylon. He's devastated. The people have returned home, but the walls of the city were still in ruins.

Why would walls make Nehemiah break down and cry? What purpose do walls serve a city? For them, it was their only defense against the evils of the world. The walls also gave them an identity as a group of people, of belonging. Without the walls they were just a group of people, with the walls they were the city of Jerusalem. Building the walls would give them a sense of purpose, of mission, which they were lacking. The fact was, they needed these walls.

In our days, as Catholics, we similarly have a need for something important in our lives that resembles the wall. What is it? Well, what protects us from the evils of the world, gives us a sense of belonging, creates community, and provides us a mission? The Church, and more specifically, our parish family of St Anthony's.

Whose job was it to help rebuild the walls of Jerusalem? EVERYONE. It began with many families coming together. Later the temple workers and the priests joined in. Everyone was needed for this task. In our day, who is responsible as well for building up the parish? EVERYONE! We all have a part to play in building up St Anthony's. We might first say Monsignor or the other priests, and for sure, they direct and spearhead our work. But we as parents, families, and parishioners, form the larger body of wall builders in our parish. All of us are truly CRUCIAL in building and maintaining our beloved home as members of the body of Christ.

So, how can you and I and all of us unitedly continue the work of building up our parish family at St Anthony's? Let's discuss that topic next in two weeks when we talk again. In the meantime, please as a family read together the book of Nehemiah. It's 13 chapters long, and several chapters have lists of names that it's ok to skip over. While you are reading, look for ways they struggled and overcame obstacles, and think about ways that you as a family overcome obstacles to being Catholic and how your family could help make St Anthony's a stronger parish.




