

FAITH FORMATION

Hello Parents! Today you and I finish together our look at the book of Nehemiah. If you have missed any of the previous columns feel free to read them on our website at www.stanthonydsm.org under the religious education section. Have you been enjoying the illustrations in your Parish Bible for Nehemiah? Please stop by the office or ask me if you don't have your own copy. Now, take a minute and offer a prayer together. Reflect on the people in Nehemiah's day. They were our ancestors in faith. They struggled just like you and I do. They had families and they faced many of the same challenges raising children in a world not friendly to their worship of God. Read over together Nehemiah chapter 4, beginning on page 549 of the Parish Bible.

Who threaten the spirituality of our children and families today? Today's culture is decidedly anti Catholic. Our public schools have eliminated almost any trace of God or thankfulness to Him. They teach ideas that as faithful Catholics we cannot agree with. Our workmates may ridicule us for even believing in a loving Creator. Parents who have children on the same team as ours may feel we are strange because we balance our love of sports and our children with our overriding need to be present every Sunday at Mass wherever we are. Today's culture wants us to fit in, not ask questions, and don't challenge the majority, especially if other people's lives aren't in harmony with what God requires of them. Our Jewish brothers also faced ridicule for their choices and what they placed as important too. Notice in Nehemiah 4:2 how the Samaritans made cruel fun of the Jews. These Samaritans were fallen away Jews! We may have Catholics in our family who no longer give God the worship he deserves. They may make fun of us for being loyal to Christ and His church, even though we are confronted with scandals. It even got so bad the Jews were afraid for their physical lives! These evil men would do anything to stop God's work.

Notice the illustration on page 550. After praying and remembering to trust in God, the people overcame their fear and continued their mission. But this time they always had a weapon on hand in case of trouble. And their strength was in numbers, so they wisely had a signal to gather together for safety and comfort.

What is our weapon today against all the evil we encounter in the world? St Padre Pio tells us! "Some people are so foolish that they think they can go through life without the help of the Blessed Mother. Love the Madonna and pray the Rosary, for her Rosary is the weapon against the evils of the world today!" October is the month of the Rosary. Do you have your weapon at hand? Are you training your family in the use of this vital weapon in the warfare for your families' souls? Please pray the Rosary together this month as a family. Come to adoration and pray together, your family and Jesus. Be like Nehemiah in chapter 6 verse 9: "They were trying to frighten us into stopping work. I prayed, "But now, God, make me strong!"

Try this month to also follow the example of the Jews in going to confession as a family. Read about their confession and their heartfelt prayer in chapter 9. Then, as a family, sit down and make your agreement together to serve God and His Church TOGETHER like the Jews did in chapter 10. Be resolved as they were in chapter 10 verse 39 to not neglect the house of our God. Our strength as Catholics is in our families and staying united together. Keep fighting parents! Don't give up. Remember always our loving God is with you. Keep your weapon at hand! Your fellow worker in Christ, Chris
