FAITH FORMATION

Hello Parents :) Today you and I are going to consider a phrase I know you've said, maybe many times.....

SLOW DOWN!

I'm sure you've said it in the store, at the pool, at Church, and probably a hundred other places. But today I'm going to say it to you.

SLOW DOWN!

Our lives are so busy in today's modern world. Often we are exhausted when we wake up, exhausted when we go to sleep, exhausted when we come back from vacation. There is always something else needing doing, from housework to yardwork to paperwork to "children work." We often feel that we have to hurry through life to accomplish the next task as quickly as possible.

Our faith lives often get caught up in this frantic cycle. We may hurry to Mass. We might take our Lord in Holy Communion and jet out the door, we've got things to get done. We may hurry through prayer. A prayer we often hurry through is the prayer before meals. We may hurry thru prayer at Mass. We may recite the creed and not even remember what we are saying. Praying the rosary under fifteen minutes might be common for us. When we go to confession we might pray the act of contrition with the speed of a runaway train. What are we teaching our children? What kind of example are we setting as parents? To all of you I say:

SLOW DOWN!

In prayer: When you pray before a meal, slow down. When you pray as a family and are saying the Our Father or Hail Mary, say it slowly and deliberately. When you offer a prayer over your children at night, don't be in a hurry to tuck them into bed and turn out their light. When you are at mass and reciting the creed, say each line with passion. When you confess your guilt during the confiator (I confess...), feel what you are saying. When you pray the rosary individually or as a family, don't be in a hurry to finish it. Life still happens around you. Enjoy being together with God.

In Mass: take your time when you enter. Slow down when you bless yourselves and your children with the holy water, remembering your baptism and adoption as a child of God. Genuflect before the tabernacle where our God is residing. Take a minute and prayerfully help your family enter into the sacredness of the Mass that is about to begin. When Mass has concluded, take a moment to be in God's presence. You may want your family to spend a few minutes of silent prayer either in the Church or in the adoration chapel. Spend some time either before or after Mass as a family in the chapel. Listen to God speaking to you there. Talk to him about the concerns that are in your heart.

"Stop fighting," he says, and know that I am God. (Psalms 46:10, page 770 in the Parish Bible)
Some translations stop fighting as be still. You and I and our families need to slow our lives, our minds, and our hearts down and let God speak to us and be with us. Listen to Him, teach your children to hear him, and you and your family will live an incredible and happy life.

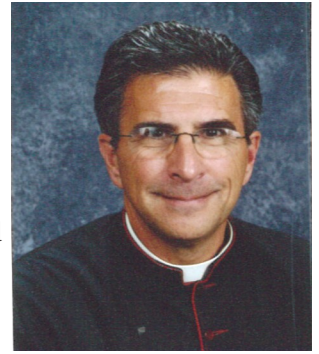
