

FAITH FORMATION

Hello Parents! Off we go into the new year and new decade! Last time we talked we reviewed together the first six months of our conversations in this column. Let's continue on with the last half of 2019 and then consider this year's focus.

In July we considered the theme: loving our neighbor as ourselves.....are we serving the community or serving ourselves? As families, what efforts are we making to bring the Gospel of Christ to people in our community? What organizations do you or your spouse belong to in helping build up St Anthony's and how are you involving your children in the ministry work you do? We finished the month with more reflections on the need for Catechists to teach our youth. This year we had around 30 volunteers assisting in this most vital work! Thank you so much for your service Catechists!

In August we examined the life of Abraham in the book of Genesis through the lens of a parent. Did you really take the time to ponder the sobering questions Abraham's example provides? In September we reflected on the great cloud of faithful servants of God mentioned in Hebrews chapter 11, the communion of saints who may include our grandparents and other loved ones!. Do you remember that one of the only ways a person can become a canonized saint recognized by the Church is if we pray to them, they take our requests to God, and He grants the petition? It's very important we keep up our communication with our loved ones who live in heaven!

In October we read together the book of Nehemiah. What spiritual riches we discovered! We saw how our struggles aren't so different from Jewish parents of several thousand years ago. What fun we had reading the book as a family and looking at the different illustrations and putting ourselves into their story. My favorite statement that month was:

"Our strength as Catholics is in our families and staying united together." It really made me reflect on how important *every* parent is at St Anthony's!

In November and December we considered three phrases we often tell our children and applied them to ourselves and our spiritual lives:

slow down

take a time out

and go outside.

At the beginning of this new year, go back and reconsider these helpful parental self care messages. Parents, you are so important to your family, the Church, and the world!

Wow! We really covered a lot of ground together as a parish family! We read the bible together, prayed together, and made plans together. What can we do in 2020? Last year our focus was learning about what a parishioner is and what should we be doing as active members of St Anthony's. This year it's time to take it up a notch! Our theme for 2020 will be:

Discerning and doing God's will in our life, family, and community

Thank you for letting me walk with you every two weeks! May God bless you and your family in 2020!

Spiritual Adoption - Month 4 "I had a dream!"

Dear Spiritual Adoption Parents,

Your baby is now 4 months old! His/her brain has begun maturing – a process that will continue until the baby is about 14 years old. Taste buds are now work-

ing. Nutrients consumed by the mother are passed onto the baby within an hour or two. Three hundred quarts of liquid a day are sent to the baby via the umbilical cord. Fine hairs begin to grow on the head, eyebrows and eyelashes. Facial expressions similar to the baby's parents can be seen at this time. This month REMs (rapid eye movements) have been recorded – a sign of dreaming.
