SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: Confession may not be celebrated in common, but only individually. No specific times are set, to avoid larger crowds. The Holy See has authorized pastors to use discretion and provide "Collective Absolution" in moments of pastoral necessity.

Baptism: Baptism in cases of serious illness or other pastoral need, may not be celebrated in common, but only individually at the priest's discretion with serious pastoral necessity. Standard health norms should be respected

Marriage: Nuptial Masses already scheduled may be celebrated with the 10 person limit; ideally, these Masses should be rescheduled after government leaders give the "all clear" notice. Any and all other public ceremonies should be rescheduled.

Funeral: Please contact a funeral home and they will notify the parish office. Per the Bishops order during the coronavirus crisis, funerals will be limited to 10 people in the church.

SPIRITUAL DIRECTION

THE CLAY OF LIFE - MOLDED FOR GOOD OR EVIL

By Monsignor Frank Chiodo Excerpt from his book, "Cross My Heart and Hope to Live"

Lizabeth Kubler Ross, a renowned author and doctor, has written volumes on the subject of death and dying. The book had been the fruit of many years or work with the terminally ill. One of the most poignant facts that she learned from her many years of research was that as the terminally ill looked back on their lives when facing death they saw in the final analysis that only two things mattered, the service they rendered others and love. All those things we think are important, like fame, money, prestige and power are insignificant!

The Gospel invites us to reflect on that poignant truth. It should cause us to pause and ask: At the end of my journey through time, will I be satisfied with the way I have loved and served others? When we are born we enter into a world which will be affected by our presence. We could say that the material world we enter is like clay which the artist works with to make of it something beautiful or something ugly. Our good or evil intentions have an impact on the world - resentments, hatred, revenge; they affect our world around us. Love and good will, patience and forgiveness, these mold and have an impact on our world also. They can make something ugly or something beautiful out of the clay of our lives.

During the fifties Sid Caesar was a popular TV personality. He wrote about his life in a book called *Where Have I Been?*. In this book Sid Caesar reveals his problem with heavy drinking and how he later became a drunk walking around in a stupor for almost twenty years. Finally in 1978 he looked in a mirror and asked: "Sid, do you want to live or do you want to die?" He wanted to live and so he quit drinking and popping pills. He writes: "I did not realize it during those twenty years of drinking, but I had stopped appreciating my wife and I didn't even talk to my children. Our family is a lot closer now. I know that you can't take twenty years of hollering and screaming and drinking and make up for it in a couple of years, but I am trying very hard." Now Sid Caesar sees something good and beautiful being molded out of the clay if his life, not something ugly and deadly. What a different world this would be, how different our families would be, how better our neighborhoods would be if all who profess Christ as Lord would give themselves to being used by Him.

God can use every human being as a channel for divine love and power. What delays the bringing of the world closer to Christ is the backwardness of His followers. It each one of us lived each day for Christ and allowed Him to work through us, then the world, our families, our neighborhoods would soon be drawn much closer to the realization of what really counts in life and in death, love and service to one another. We should soon realize that those things we think are so important like fame, pleasure, money, prestige and power don't mean a thing when weighted in the eternal balance.

I often wonder if those who have gone before us in death could relay to us one, only one single message from the beyond, what it would be? I think it would be this: Seek after those things which really matter, seek after the love of God and the care and concern for one another. At the end of your journey through time, will you be satisfied with the way you have loved and served your God and others? Take the clay of your life and mold something beautiful for God.

(Route subject to change) To <u>register your car</u> to be in the motorcade, go to to <u>StAnthonyDSM.org</u>

1.Start at the St. Anthony Grotto: SW 1st Street and Dunham Ave. Line up behind START truck.

2.East on Dunham Ave to South Union Street North to Jackson Ave.

3.East on Jackson Ave to SE 3^{rd} Street and then South to Edison Ave.

4.West on Edison Ave to SE 1st Street turn South follow the curve west on Indianola Road.

5.Indianola Road becomes Thomas Beck. Turn South on SW 9th and head into Mac Rae Park up to the EMC Overlook.

6.At the EMC Overlook, stop to bless Des Moines.

7.Leave park going south on SW 11th Street.

8.Turn West onto Davis Ave to SW 12^{th} Street.

9.Go south on 12th Street to Park Ave turn west and go one block to SW 12th PL and turn South.

10.Go to Thornton Ave and turn East. Turn North on South Union to Hartford Ave and go East. 11.Turn South onto Indianola Ave back to St. Anthony.
