Funeral: Please contact a funeral home and they will notify the parish office.



Dear Parish family,

It was a personal joy to see many of you at Mass last weekend. I realize many wish they could have joined us in person but were unable. This is understandable. Please exercise caution and know that even when not here personally you can join us online, and you are remembered in prayer. The bishop has granted a dispensation from Mass til we arrive on

the safe side of this pandemic.

I want to thank so many for following our healthcare protocols. The vast majority of you at the majority of Masses wore a mask and kept social distance. Please continue to do your part to keep all of us safe.

Here again are the expectations for Mass attendance.

Please observe some extra precautions when at Mass:

- Use a sanitizer before coming to Mass. AND PEOPLE AGE FIVE AND ABOVE ARE STRONGLY ENCOURAGED TO WEAR A MASK AT CHURCH AND DURING MASS EXCEPT WHEN RECEIVING COMMUNION.
- SOME OF THE CHURCH DOORS WILL BE LEFT AJAR SO THAT YOU MAY ENTER WITHOUT TOUCHING THE DOOR HANDLE.
- Sit six feet apart---those who came in the same car are an exception.
- Every other pew is closed.
- Come to communion in a single line.. PLEASE KEEP 6 FEET APART.
- The Bishop urges and requests communion on the hand f you receive on the tongue, try to remain at the end of the communion line.

The Priest or Deacon /Minister will use sanitizer between communions when the hand is touched while distributing or communion is given on the tongue.

This weekend we celebrate our national birthday. Our country needs so desperately a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit. This pandemic is a wake-up call to reintroduce God to the center of our national life.

SPIRITUAL DIRECTION

WE NEED PEOPLE OF CHARACTER

Excerpt from his book, "Cross My Heart and Hope to Live."

Tom Landry, former Dallas Cowboys coach, was asked what he looked for when he drafted men for his team. He said, "The first thing I look for is character." He was then asked, "What if you find a terrific athlete who lacks character?" "That's easy," said Landry, "we don't hire him!" "Character," wrote Herbert Spender, "is man's greatest need and man's greatest safeguard." D.L. Moody said, "Character is what you are in the dark.

True character is what we are when nobody is looking, in the secret chambers of the heart." Character is what Christ calls us to have. Character is the inner strength that holds us up when the pressures of life try to get us down. A lot of stressors and pressures, trials and temptations try to push us down and squeeze out any semblance of character. Yet, what the world needs more than ever is people of strong and moral character.

The horrific and terrifying mass murders in schools point to the urgency to develop strong, moral character in our youth. We cannot look for sterling examples of character in many of our political leaders. Our heroes on television and in the movies likewise lack character. Most of them are violent, greedy, sex- crazed individualists who seek only their own satisfaction.

No, the only sure example of character, the only unblemished hero we can all look up to, the man who possesses the qualities every man, woman or child must seek to imitate, is Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ who is our Lord, our Savior, the shepherd of our souls. As St. Peter tells us in chapter two, verses 21 through 23 of his first letter, "Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example that you should follow his steps. He who committed no sin, nor was deceit found in His mouth. He who, when He was reviled, did not revile in return. When He suffered, He did not threaten, but committed Himself to Him who judges righteously."

Each of us can take one of two roads in life: the road of becoming more like Christ, or the road to dead end and damnation. Which road have you chosen? To be a person of character means to become more Christ-like. In order to become more Christ-like we have to come to know Christ better.

There are two primary ways to know Jesus: the Bible and prayer. If you haven't picked your Bible up in months, you have a problem. And the problem is you! How serious is the person who will be traveling a great distance and yet doesn't even look at a roadmap? St. Jerome once said, "Ignorance of the Bible is ignorance of Christ."

How well do you REALLY know Jesus? Jesus is the shepherd whose voice His sheep recognize. Do you recognize His voice? Prayer is the second primary way to know Jesus; two special ways are to pray before the Blessed Sacrament or before a crucifix. The time spent in quiet before the Blessed Sacrament unlocks the very gates of paradise, and shows us Jesus. In the Blessed Sacrament we listen to Jesus tell us about himself. There we learn to become more like Him. Spend time silently staring at the crucifix. Listen to Christ tell you what love really looks like, and what being like Him requires. See that broken, battered, and bruised body of His. Open your heart to Jesus on the crucifix. Christ will change you if you spend time in prayer before the crucifix.


