Dear Parishioners,



We deepen our faith through scriptures while seeking to sustain our faith through brotherhood. Those who fear the Lord direct their friendship aright, for as they are, so are their neighbors also. Sirach 6:17 Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Did you know that you do not have to be subject to worries, fears or anxiety? You can, if you choose, be so full of peace that Paul describes it as a peace that passes all understanding and that your heart and mind will be guarded. Meaning, your thoughts and feelings can be at peace. Wow. Funny thing about peace...when we have it, we also have greater love for those around us. We also don't have anger, fear and all those nasty feelings that tend to steal our thoughts away from the goodness of our Lord.

So how can you gain that kind of peace? Paul tells us in Philippians 4:6. The way Paul explains it isn't really too hard but there is some effort of the will. Here's an easy breakdown with some commentary:

1. Agree to follow God's plan for your life which includes no anxiety. None. This requires faith and an act of your will.

2. Begin by praying about whatever you need to talk to God about. Have a discussion with Him about anything and everything. Really open up. You *must* pray to get this process started. Talk with Him about everything.

3. Make your petition to the Father and pray in the name of Jesus. Be free to ask Him for your needs but always that His will be done. We want the "perfect" will of God in our lives.

4. Continue praying but now express your thankfulness for whatever you're going through and for all the Lord has done in your life. Consider that God knows all things and wants your good. Go into "thanksgiving mode." If your struggling with being thankful, pray for a thankful heart. Petition the Lord for this gift. If you are unwilling to be thankful, you will not be able to find peace. Being thankful is key to having peace. It means you trust God with all things and believe He is in control and that you're ok with that.

5. Finally, control what you think about. Yes, you *can* control your thoughts. God commands us to love Him with all our hearts, MINDS, and strength. It is possible to love God with your mind. Reject thoughts that are not profitable for your soul and focus on whatever is true, honorable, just, pure, lovely, gracious or excellent.

Practice this process each day:

Pray, petition and be thankful for all things.

Then the peace that passes all understanding will be yours.




