Marriage: At least one of the parties must be registered and a practicing member of the parish. Please contact the office at least 8 months prior to the proposed date of the wedding.


Funeral: Please contact a funeral home and they will notify the parish office.

FAITH FORMATION

What's Holding You Back? Part I

Hello Parents!

This month in confirmation students will examine this vital question, and we also must ponder it as well. Last month we discussed God's dream for you and me and our children, to become the best version of ourselves, the persons God created us to be. But because of our fallen nature, the disordered desires that exist in all of us, living our best life is a challenge. Paul wrote in Romans 7:19: "I do not do the good i want, but the evil I do not want is what I do."

God created us with the desire to be happy....forever. The culture tries to sell us a poor substitute: pleasure. Our world says pleasure and happiness are the same thing. IT'S A LIE. God does want us to experience much pleasure in life. But the difference between pleasure and happiness is this: *Pleasure cannot be sustained beyond the activity producing it.* For example, when we eat, we feel pleasure. Stop eating, and the pleasure stops. That's why we don't stop eating. Seventy-five percent of the time when we are eating we are not actually hungry. But we like the pleasure of eating, so we keep eating - that is the only way to maintain the pleasure. Pleasure cannot be sustained beyond the activity producing it.

Happiness is different. Happiness is sustainable. When i make the decision to spend time with God in prayer or scripture or some other spiritual pursuit, I feel happy. The happiness I feel from drawing closer to God lasts beyond the time I spend doing it. I have an inner peace and contentment. It's similar to when instead of sitting in front of the tv and wasting my evening watching Netflix or sports I spend some time exercising. The time after I exercise I still feel good, tho maybe sore later!


Children 14 years and under will also be registered for Operation Santa Claus.
