Marriage: At least one of the parties must be registered and a practicing member of the parish. Please contact the office at least 8 months prior to the proposed date of the wedding.



My Dear Parishioners,

We had a beautiful day last Saturday as a sizeable crowd gathered at our grotto to pray the Rosary for our nation and world. We had some folks from St. Joseph parish joining us as we invoked the name of the Mother of God to intercede for us during this time

of national crisis.

During the plague that killed thousands in Rome in the year 590, Pope Gregory the Great led many processions through the city pleading with our Heavenly Mother that she intercede with her Divine Son for a deliverance from the scourge of the plague. A large image of the Mother of God was carried in procession. FAITH FORMATION

Brothers and Sisters.

In today's Gospel Jesus is confronted by the disciples of the Pharisees who's purpose was to trip him up by asking about taxes, but knowing their malice, the Lord asks them a question and then said back to them, "Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's and to God the things that are God's."

Yes, we must give what we owe to the world but we must also give what we owe to God. Are we giving to God what is due?

He commands us to love Him with all our hearts, minds, soul and strength and to love our neighbor as ourselves. That's the short version of saying, keep the Commandments. We are also to defend the truth and live the Gospel by letting it transform how we think and what we do. We must, out of love for God and souls, share the Lord's Word with those who have not yet been adopted into the Kingdom of God. Inviting them to be baptized and come to know Him. Yet, it is our duty to speak the truth, not just because it is right, but because the truth saves souls. Lies lead to death. Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth and life and no one comes to the Father but by me." We must speak about Jesus and not shrink away from being bold in the face of so much evil.

Stand up for the unborn and vote prolife. Stand up for marriage for it can only be between a man and a woman. Love those who are confused about gender and tell them that God created them for a purpose. And now, vote to advance the Kingdom of God on these issues. Let us pray for the conversion of souls and our nation. Let us give God what is due and love Him by our actions.


