

Hello Parents!

Merry Christmas! Are you ready to begin a life changing habit? As you begin the prayer process, practice it a few times on your own. Then you will be ready to introduce it to your family. There are two reasons most people don't pray: nobody ever taught them and they don't know where to start. The Prayer Process solves both of these problems. It teaches us how to pray and it gives us a simple step-by-step process, so we know exactly where to start. Begin with taking a few deep breaths, letting go of any stress or anxiety. Let's begin:

"In the name of the father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit, Amen." (make the sign of the cross)

1. **GRATITUDE:** Begin by thanking God in a personal dialogue for whatever you are most grateful for today.

2. **AWARENESS:** Revisit the times in the past twentyfour hours when you were and were not the-best-version -of-yourself. Talk to God about these situations and what you learned from them.

3. **SIGNIFICANT MOMENTS:** Identify something you experienced in the past twenty-four hours and explore what God might be trying to say to you through that event (or person).

4. **PEACE:** Ask God to forgive you for any wrong you have committed (against yourself, another person, or Him) and to fill you with a deep and abiding peace.

5. **FREEDOM:** Speak with God about how He is inviting you to change your life so that you can experience the freedom to be the-best-version-of-yourself.

6. **OTHERS:** Lift up to God anyone you feel called to pray for today, asking God to bless and guide them.

7. Pray the Our Father.

You get good at riding a bicycle, not by reading a book about bikes or listening to a lecture about riding techniques, but by actually riding a bicycle. Sure, the book and the lecture can be helpful, but ultimately you will hone your skills by spending time on the bike.

The same is true for prayer. It's good to talk about it and to read books about it, but at some point the best thing to do is just try it and see what you learn from actually praying. Watch Mathew Kelly guide you through the prayer process: <u>https://</u>

Year End Giving

Alumni Tuition Assistance Campaign

With less than a week remaining in 2020, a charitable donation to the **Alumni Tuition Assistance Campaign** to help families in need is an excellent way to reduce your tax burden for the year, while helping St. Anthony church continue to fulfill its mission.

What are the tax benefits to making a gift before the end of the year?

For parishioners who itemize deductions on their annual tax return, gifts made by December 31 can be claimed as a charitable tax deduction on your 2020 income tax return. A donor can total up their cash gifts to any qualifying organization for 2020 and claim a deduction for up to 50% of their adjusted gross income. For a gift to count towards your 2020 income tax return, <u>the parish must receive your donation by</u> <u>December 31.</u>

How does the CARES Act impact my 2020 Required Minimum Distribution (RMD)?

The CARES Act waives RMD payments for 2020, including for inherited IRAs. It establishes a new, above-the-line deduction (universal or non-itemized deduction that applies to all taxpayers) for total charitable contributions of up to \$300. The incentive applies to contributions made in 2020 and would be claimed on tax forms next year (Section 2204). The bill also lifts the existing cap on annual contributions for those who itemize, raising it from 60 percent of adjusted gross income to 100 percent.

Christmas is Not Over on December 26...It's Just Beginning

The tree shouldn't come down the day after Christmas because our faith teaches that Christmas does not occur *before* Christmas, but in the days following. What comes before Christmas Day is the season of Advent. Christmas runs from Christmas Day until the Epiphany, which is January 6, 2021.

Epiphany means manifestation. What the Church celebrates is the manifestation of our Lord to the whole world; after being made known to the shepherds of Bethlehem He is revealed to the Magi who have come from the East to adore Him. Christian tradition has seen in the Magi the first fruits of the Gentiles; they are the first for all the peoples of the earth, and thus the Epiphany is an affirmation of universal salvation.


