God the Father calls us to live in hope by drawing us into a relationship with his Son Jesus Christ. It is through Jesus that we have this hope and are able to become adopted sons and daughters of Almighty God. We also know that God does not disappoint, because He cannot lie. We know that He is always faithful and that His promises are true. We can rest in the assurance that evil will not triumph over good.

Christians are the light of the world and are asked to share the teachings of Jesus with others. Sadly, it seems that Christianity can become a self-help program leading us away from our calling to engage in the battle for souls. This can also lead us into a spiritual slumber. But Jesus tells us to stay awake!

The Church teaches us that there is a *Church Trium-phant* (Members of the Church in heaven), the *Church Suffering* (Members of the Church in purgatory), and the *Church Militant* (Members of the Church who are alive in this world...that's us). As the members of the Church Militant, we are in spiritual warfare, whether we are aware of it or not. Paul reminds us, "For we wrestle not against flesh and blood; but against principalities and powers, against the rulers of the world of this present darkness, against the spirits of wickedness in the high places." (*Ephesians 6:12*)

To stay spiritually awake and to engage in the work of the Lord requires that we pray faithfully and with faith. Talk to God. It calls us to be in a state of grace through regular repentance and confession. We must also be convinced that this life is only temporary and our true work here is to be active in the salvation of souls, including our own soul. Do not be distracted by the fear of death.

Practice this week thinking about scripture throughout your day and ask the Lord to protect the words He gives you so that the enemy cannot pluck the seed of knowledge from your memory, or that the issues of the world cannot choke His words from your thoughts—These are called distractions.

Then practice...

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice...The Lord is at hand. Have no anxiety about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will keep your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:4, 6-7)

Remember who you are in Christ—You are adopted sons and daughters destined to inherit the Kingdom of God. God's love will, if you choose to receive it, cover you in His mercy of forgiveness. He will walk with you through your trials and challenges. You can, if you choose, be free. You may, if you choose, have life abundantly. Let Him lift you up into His loving arms to receive all the spiritual blessings He has stored up for you. Begin with faith, then pray and trust that He is able to do all things for those who love Him...He is who He claims.


