My Dear Family of St. Anthony,

Every family requires a genuine concern for the welfare of the other members of that family. As a church family, the Lord reminds us that we are in a certain sense, "Our brother's keeper." The third Lenten practice is almsgiving or acts of mercy and compassion for one another. One saint put it this way: "Prayer knocks at God's

door, fasting obtains, and mercy receives." Prayer, fasting and acts of compassion are one.

#### FAITH FORMATION

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Are you taking up your cross daily and following the Lord? While our spirits are willing to do God's will, our flesh is not so willing. There is always a battle between the flesh and the spirit. The flesh leads us into sin, while the spirit leads us to God.

To fight against the weakness of our flesh, we must, by an act of our will, die to self (take up our cross), pray and invite the Holy Spirit to strengthen us to follow Jesus and do the will of the Father.

What does this look like in practical terms? Sometimes it means to abandon the need to be right, or maybe to restrain from telling someone they offended us. It will always mean to forgive others when they have wronged us. We are called to a Christian life of forgiveness, but that cannot be done while at the same time we hold onto grudges. To forgive when wronged is not easy. This is when we die to self for the sake of Christ.

Death to the flesh is an act of the will, and with Gods Grace we are able to do it. And it can be sobering to consider that if we are unwilling to forgive, God will not forgive us—just as we recite in the Lord's Prayer..."Forgive us our trespasses AS WE forgive those who trespass against us." Forgiveness in nonoptional.

Forgiving others and turning away from sin requires *prayer and practice*. The Lord will provide little tests along the journey to help strengthen us to follow Him. Victory comes by the help of the Lord who enables us to do the Father's will. This way of living is hard and it requires prayer.

I Peter 4:1 says, "Since therefore Christ suffered in the flesh, arm yourselves with the same thought, for whoever has suffered in the flesh has ceased from sin, so as to live for the rest of the time in the flesh no longer by human passions but by the will of God." He goes on to say in I Peter 5:6, "Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God...be sober, be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring loin, seeking someone to devour. Resist him firm in your faith knowing that the same experience of suffering is required of your brotherhood throughout the world. And after you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore establish and strengthen you." Paul says in Romans 5:3 "Rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us."

So, we grow in our suffering. Therefore, the next time someone cuts you off in traffic or someone irritates you — forgive them. Make it a practice to die to self for the sake of doing the will of God. Choose the path of love. You will find that you will be less angry, less tired, and life will be just a little lighter. Besides, why willingly drink the poison of sin and unforgiveness. Follow Jesus and live a life of freedom. Be watchful—pray. God loves us and has chosen us to be His children. Godliness is hard work but with great reward. Live for Jesus,

### \$1,500 TUITION GRANT FOR NEW FAMILIES!



Hey Parents! Are you interested in a St. Anthony School education for your child, but concerned about tuition? Thanks to the Welcome Tuition Grant program, your child could qualify for a \$1,500 grant to help offset the cost of tuition your first two years.
