The Holy Spirit—Part One

Hello Parents!

This month students explore the depths of the mysterious third person of the trinity, God the Holy Spirit. Who is he? In the Scriptures God is revealed as the Father who creates us (Genesis 1), his Son who redeems us (Matthew 1), and the Holy Spirit who inspires us (Acts 1). The whole history we find in the Bible is the story of God's ongoing concern for the human family, and for each of us individually as his children.

The Holy Spirit is the Third Person of the Trinity. He is the one whom Jesus promised the Father would send to guide and encourage us. When you think of it, the Holy Spirit is incredibly practical. How often in your life do you need guidance and encouragement? Whether you are aware of it or not, you need these things every day, and the Holy Spirit is within you to provide them. But it would be a mistake to think that the Holy Spirit just came into being after Jesus died and rose from the dead. The Spirit has always been with the Father and the Son. Open your Bibles to the very beginning and you will discover the Holy Spirit in the second verse. Genesis 1:2 reads, "In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while the Spirit of God was moving over the face of the waters."

Every important moment, from the beginning of creation, the start of Jesus the savior's work in the world, to the foundation of the Church created to unite all mankind together and with their God, the Holy Spirit has been there and a part of. In fact, Jesus left the Holy Spirit here on Earth....FOR US! He is there to guide us, to console us, to be with us throughout our lives. The powerful creative and inspiring member of the Trinity wants to be part of your life. He loves you. **Will you let him?** Will you and your family and your student journeying towards the sacrament of confirmation really let him into your lives and enjoy his friendship and help during your time here on Earth?

Start today. Together with your family. Let your confirmation student lead this prayer:
