Dear Brothers and Sisters,

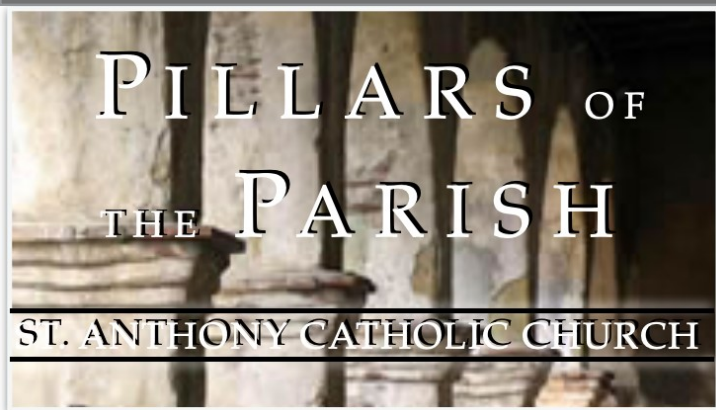
Today is Pentecost and it's a glorious day! Consider the early Christians who prayed nine days in obedience to the Lord waiting for the promise of the Holy Spirit. These same men witnessed the Lord do many amazing miracles and pledged their lives to Him. Yet they ended up running in fear of the Jewish leaders, and Peter denied Jesus, not once, but three times. Fast forward to Pentecost. **Those same men, being filled with the Holy Spirit, went from men of fear and shame, to faith and boldness.** Being filled with the Holy Spirit is the Lord's plan for us. We need the Holy Spirit while on this journey to serve and bear fruit for God. Pentecost isn't just a story ABOUT the early Christians, it is for us today. We can and should be filled with the Holy Spirit. The Lord wants us to receive the help we need to accomplish the work He has prepared for us. Sadly, we can be in a state of spiritual slumber that keeps us dull of heart and hearing. This is a form of backsliding. We become lazy in prayer and fail to engage in the battle for souls. Keep in mind it's never too late to stop listening to the world and to turn your eyes and ears completely to the good Shepherd. Choose daily to love God over the world. We are all blind and dead without Him. Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to fill you and lead you each day to discern the truth and to live holy. Begin again today, the birthday of the church!

## CATECHISM HIGHLIGHTS

**Topic: Man's Response to God—Obedience of Faith**

**142** By his Revelation, the invisible God, from the fullness of his love, addresses men as his friends, and moves among them, in order to invite and receive them into his own company." The adequate response to this invitation is faith.

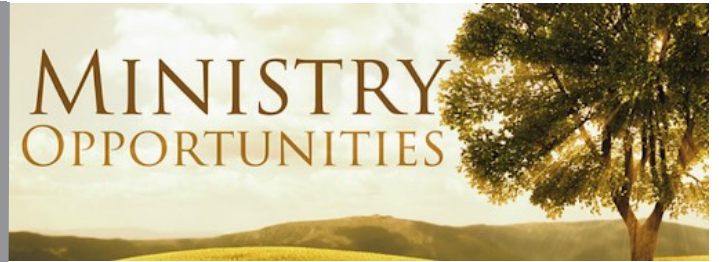
**143** By faith, man completely submits his intellect and his will to God. With his whole being man gives his assent to God the revealer. Sacred Scripture calls this human response to God, the author of revelation, "the obedience of faith."

**144** To obey (from the Latin ob-audire, to "hear or listen to") in faith is to submit freely to the word that has been heard, because its truth is guaranteed by God, who is Truth itself...

**150** As personal adherence to God and assent to His truth, Christian faith differs from our faith in any human person. It is right and just to entrust oneself wholly to God and to believe absolutely what He says. It would be futile and false to place such faith in a creature. (Jer 17-5; Ps40:5; 146:3-4)

**152** One cannot believe in Jesus Christ without sharing in his Spirit. It is the Holy Spirit who reveals to men who Jesus is. For "no one can say 'Jesus is Lord,' except by the Holy Spirit, who "searches everything, even the depths of God...No one comprehends the thoughts of God, except the Spirit of God." Only God knows God completely: We believe in the Holy Spirit because He is God.
