Next weekend is one of the biggest weekends for St. Anthony. The Corpus Christi procession has been a trademark since 1913, when thousands assembled along the streets of the old southside to hail and praise the Lord Jesus, present in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Come

and join us at 11am to celebrate bilingual Mass at our Grotto, followed by procession which stops at five houses along the route for prayer and benediction. Afterwards the Pillar of the Parish awards will be conferred and food for all. I hope to see you there.

June 13th is the feast of St. Anthony. Our Hispanic brothers and sisters are providing food and music throughout the day. After the 11-o clock Mass we will process the statue of St. Anthony to the Grotto where we will pray the litany in honor of St. Anthony.

I want to mention a grave concern of mine. Over the past few years, a considerable number of our parish family have died and have been buried without the benefit of a funeral Mass. CATECHISM HIGHLIGHTS

Topic: The Holy Spirit Makes Present the Mystery of Christ

1101 The Holy Spirit gives a spiritual understanding of the Word of God to hose who read or hear it, according to the dispositions of their hearts. By means of the words, actins, and symbols that form the structure of a celebration, the Spirit puts both the faithful and the ministers into a living relationship with Christ, the Word and Image of the Father, so that they can live out the meaning of what they hear, contemplate, and do in the celebration.

1102 By the saving word of God, faith...is nourished in the hearts of believers. By this faith then the congregation of the faithful begins and grows. The proclamation does not stop with a teaching; it elicits the *response of faith* as consent and commitment, directed at the covenant between God and his people. Once again it is the Holy Spirit who gives the grace of faith, strengthens it and makes it grow in the community. The liturgical assembly is first of all a communion in faith.

1104 Christian liturgy no only recalls the events that saved us but actualizes them, makes them present. The Paschal mystery of Christ is celebrated, not repeated. It is the celebrations that are repeated, and in each celebration there is an outpouring of the Holy Spirit tht makes the unique mystery present.


