Dear Friends,

I want to share with you something I wrote in my book, *“What Senses Fail to Fathom...the Eucharist”*:

“How lovely is your dwelling place O Lord God of hosts”...I learned early in my life, the truth of that statement. I was in the third grade during a typically frightening April storm in Iowa. Having left the school building during a tornado warning, I took shelter in the church until the school bus arrived. When I finally found my way back to the school, when the storm abated, I was confronted by a group of frantic religious sisters. “Where were you? We were looking all over for you.” “I was in church,” I muttered. Then one of the nuns made a statement, the import of which has been seared into the very fiber of my soul. She said, “No better place could you be during a storm than with Jesus in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.” Those were truly anointed words; I have carried them in my heart from that day on. This basic and fundamental truth is one of the crown jewels of all the truths of our faith: Jesus is truly present body, blood, soul and divinity in the Blessed Sacrament. This is the truth not always appreciated, too often forgotten, sometimes underest-
imated, occasionally doubted or denied.” (ch. 15)

On this important feast day of Corpus Christi, we walk the walk of our faith in public display as we honor the Lord in a Eucharistic procession, honoring the Blessed Sacrament. We come together as one body in Christ with love for our Lord.

May we love the Him with all our hearts, minds, souls and strength and our brothers and sisters, for the glory of God.

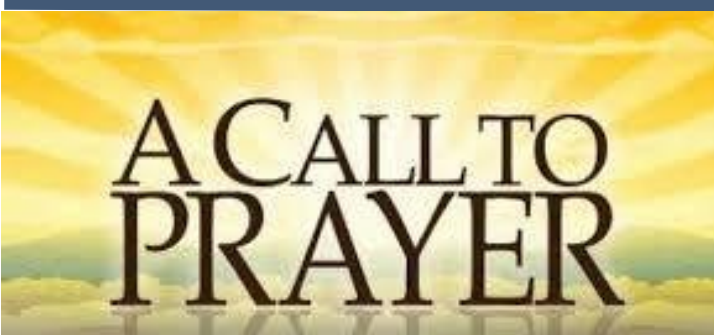

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Monsignor Chiodo has asked me to begin raising funds for the needs of the church and school while also continuing in my communications role. Fundraising is something I've done in the past but never for a church or school. (What a great cause!)

Giving to God, whether it be our time or our treasure is a way we worship Him. My mom, who was a saint in my mind, would always remind me that we receive from the church and it is our obligation to give back. She equated it with duty. There is a great truth to that, but God does not want people to give to him unless they are cheerful givers, who give out of love for Him, and want to advance the kingdom of God.

In my past work as a fundraiser, I spent a lot of time learning about people and their habits of why they gave. In all that I learned, one thing struck me as fascinating, which was that those who gave to God from a young age, regardless of their circumstances (good or bad), ended up doing very well financially later in life. God blessed them. From my own personal experience as a believer, I chose to set aside 10% of my income for the Lord. There is no question, God has been faithful to take care of me, and I have never been in want. We are called to trust Him with our lives which includes our finances. We need to be convinced that He will never abandon us. I like to tell my grandchildren...there is nothing impossible for God. Nothing. Live in peace knowing the Lord will never fail you.

This new task will be similar to all the others Monsignor has called me to do. That is to share the teaching of Christ and help those in the church to fulfill their work for the Lord. We all have a calling and there is a season in our lives for different tasks. God knows what He wants us to do. We can rest in confidence that He is in charge.

One final word to meditate on...Giving our lives to the Lord is a day to day commitment. Another thing my mother said to me *everyday* growing up was, "Commit your day to the Lord." She spent her whole adult life ministering to people, telling them about Jesus. Like her, each one of us is given someone in our lives to minister to. Consider giving them a word of life—a truth to know.

CATECHISM HIGHLIGHTS

Topic: The Holy Spirit Makes Present the Mystery of Christ (continued from last week)

1105 The Epiclesis (“invocation upon”) is the intercession in which the priest begs the Father to send the Holy Spirit, the Sanctifier, so that the offerings may become the body and blood of Christ and that the faithful, by receiving them, may themselves become a living offering to God.

1106 Together with the anamnesis, the epiclesis is at the heart of each sacramental celebration, most especially of the Eucharist:

“You ask how the bread becomes the Body of Christ, and the wine...the Blood of Christ. I shall tell you: the Holy Spirit comes upon them and accomplishes what surpasses every word and through...Let it be enough for you to understand that it is by the Holy Spirit, just as it was the Holy Virgin and by the Holy Spirit that the Lord, through and in himself, took flesh.” (St. John Damascene, De fide orth)

1107 The Holy Spirit’s transforming power in the liturgy hastens the coming of the kingdom and the consummation of the mystery of salvation. While we wait in hope he causes us really to anticipate the fullness of communion with the Holy Trinity. Sent by the Father who hears the epiclesis of the Church, the Spirit gives life to those who accept him and is even now, the “guarantee” of their inheritance.

Procession to the Grotto after 11am Mass



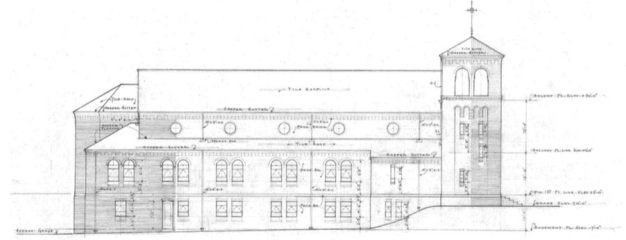
