FAITH FORMATION

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I would like to encourage you to make the sign of the cross in your daily living. Not only is it a reminder of our faith, but it gives testimony to those who live in a faithless world.

"The sign of the cross, on the threshold of the celebration, marks with the imprint of Christ the one who is going to belong to him and signifies the grace of the redemption Christ won for us by his cross." "Make the sign of the cross from left to right, which means from death to life, from misery to glory." (CCC 1235)

God saved us through the cross and transferred us from the left to the right (Matthew 25:33). The left signifies 'damnation' the right signifies 'mercy." Pope Innocent III in the 13th century said, "Make the sign of the cross from left to right, which mean from death to life, from misery to glory."

Saint Ephrem the Syrian (306—373 A.D.) "My son, mark all you do with the sign of the life giving cross. Do not go out from the door of your house until you have signed yourself with the sign of the cross. Do not neglect to make that sign whether you are eating or drinking, or going to sleep, whether you are at home, or going to sleep, whether you are at home, or going to sleep, whether you are at home, or going on a journey. There is no habit to be compared with it. Let it be like a wall that protects you and your conduct; teach it to your children so that they may faithfully learn the custom."

Saint Augustine of Hippo, 4th century, in a sermon on Psalm 141 said, "Let me not have my forehead bare - let the cross of my Lord cover it."

Using three fingers together to signify the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, begin at the top of your head and go from right to left across your chest reflecting on what the Lord did and is doing for our salvation. He is the way truth and life and the Cross is our standard to proclaim. It is through the cross that our Lord chose to win the victory over death.

May we take up our cross daily to live for and through Jesus. Kim Lehman


