your cross and bless you for your efforts. It is a powerful way to stay faithful to Him.

Finally, to *follow Jesus* means to learn about Him so that you can be more like Him, telling others of the Kingdom of God-to repent from their sins that separates them from the Father and to receive the mercy and love of God. Loving the Lord is to be faithful to the truth without mixing it with the lies of the world. Jesus was a constant offense as He went around teaching the truth. In todays world the lie that there is more than one truth is perpetrated by the Devil. Once someone believes that lie, then they can be led to believe anything. Following the Lord also includes reading the Word of God and prayer.

The life of the cross is hard but how much harder it is to live without God. There is no other way to be forgiven or to be restored to the Father except through Christ. He is the Savior. It is a lie from the pit of hell to believe that a sin cannot be forgiven or that some sin is acceptable (ok) with God. To be faithful to God is to accept His laws and precepts. We must be sorry and ask for mercy. He is faithful and just to forgive us—but we must acknowledge the sin.
