Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I think that sometimes it feels as though the world is at it's worst and that it will never get better and then we learn about past generations and events that happened to them which drew them closer to the living God and even helped them to remember that God is always at work in our lives. I want to share this story with you and ask that when you are finished reading it that you meditate on how the Lord is working in your life during this crisis in our world.

Advent Miracles--

A letter from Fr. Delp Inside a Prison

"I see this year's Advent with an intensity and presentiment like never before. When I pace back and forth in my cell, three steps forward and three steps back, hands in irons, ahead of me an unknown destiny, I understand very differently than before those ancient promises of the coming Lord who will redeem us and set us free. And along with these thoughts comes the memory of the angel of that a good person gave me for Advent two years ago. It held a banner: "Rejoice, for the Lord is near."

The terror of this time would not be bearable—any more than the terror brought on by our world situation, if we comprehend it—except for this other knowledge that continually encourages us and sets us straight. It is the knowledge of the promises that are being spoken right in the middle of the terror and that are valid. And it is also knowledge of the quiet angels of annunciation, who speak their message of blessing into the distress and scatter their seeds, of the blessing that will begin to grow in the middle of the night. These are not yet the loud angels of public jubilation and fulfillment, these angels of Advent. Silently and unnoticed, they come into private rooms and appear before our hearts as they did long ago. Silently they bring the questions of God and proclaim to us the miracles of God, with whom nothing is impossible."

(Fr. Delp (+1945) was a German Jesuit priest condemned to death by the Nazis.)

Remember that there is nothing that happens in your life that God is not able to change. It is His will that we must seek as we trust Him with our lives. Whatever that may be!

SPIRITUAL WARFARE

Topic: Weapons: Family Intercessory Prayer
Excerpts from "A Family Guide to Spiritual Warfare"
by Kathleen Beckman

Intercessory prayer is a weapon against sin and evil. The Catechism defines intercession as follows: "intercession is prayer of petition which leads us to pray as Jesus did. He is the one intercessor with the Father on behalf of all men, especially sinners. He is 'able for all time to save those who draw near to God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them.' The Holy Spirit 'himself intercedes for us... and intercedes for the saints according to the will of God'" (CCC 2634). A hallmark of an intercessor is that "he who prays looks 'not only to his own interests but also to the interests of others,' even to the point of praying for those who do him harm" (CCC 2635). The scope of intercessory prayer knows no bounds. Intercession could be understood as the prayer that especially moves God's Heart. "But Moses implored the Lord his God saying, 'O Lord, why does your wrath burn hot against your people...'. Turn from your fierce wrath, and repent of this evil which he thought to do to his people" (Exod. 31:11, 12,14). This passage shows three dimensions of intercession: action, prayer, and offering. Moses took action, standing between a sinful people and their angry God. He prayed that God would relent, and he offered himself as a living sacrifice to do whatever God commanded. This is the essence of intercessory prayer. This is how we pray for loved ones.
