#### Did you know ...?

"The inclination to sin that human nature has is called concupiscence."

Hello everyone,

Today we'll know the importance of reconciliation to enter into intimacy with God. As we are weak people who do what we do not want, offending God and our brothers, the Lord has left us the Sacrament of Reconciliation to heal the wounds that these offenses leave in our hearts. Sin is not a stain; it is a disease that can lead to death. It is a mysterious action that harms our happiness. Sin by separating us from God robs us of happiness and makes us experience the effects of death: loneliness, anguish, frustration, etc. Sin leads us to death.

All the prohibitions of God's Law seek that man does not experience this death. God is the only one who has the power to forgive sins and gave that power to Christ, Christ to His Apostles, the apostles to the bishops who are their successors, and the bishops to the priests.

To understand the reality of sin and the process followed to restore friendship with God and return to communion with Him, Jesus gave the parable we know as "the prodigal son." In it we see how man abandons and rejects God wanting to live according to his own criteria and how God is always eagerly waiting for him to return to him, not to reprimand or punish him but to fill him with his blessings and bring him back home.

In this parable we find the process of returning to the father that we must follow in our process of reconciliation. In this parable we see how the boy separates himself from his father, experiences the consequences of his action and ends up eating the food of the pigs, disgusting animals for the Jews. Likewise, the Christian when sinning abandons God to live according to his passions and experiences the consequences of sin.

In this situation, the boy decides to return to his father and becomes aware of his actions and the consequences. This is what in reconciliation is called an "examination of conscience" and allows us to discover our mistakes, from there the return begins with a repentant heart. The encounter with the Father is the Eucharist feast in which the loving embrace with God is given, once again we are at home. This implies making decisions not to eat pig food again, that is, a true repentance...

### LENTEN MEDITATIONS

Topic: 40 Days

The Apostles legislated for our weakness, by instituting, at the very commencement of the Christian Church, that the Solemnity of Easter should be preceded by a universal Fast; and it was only natural, to make this period of Penance to consist of Forty Days, seeing that our Divine Master had consecrated that number by his own Fast. St. Jerome, St. Leo the Great, St. Cyril of Alexandria, St. Isidore of Seville, and others of the Holy Fathers, assure us that Lent was instituted by the Apostles.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, which lasts for 40 days, not including Sundays. The present fasting and abstinence laws are: On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, the faithful fast (having only one full meal a day and smaller snacks to keep up one's strength) and abstain from meat; on the other Fridays of Lent, the faithful abstain from meat. People are still encouraged "to give up something" for Lent as a sacrifice.

If you give something up for the Lord, stick to it without acting like a Pharisee who looked for a loophole. Moreover, an emphasis must be placed on performing spiritual works, like attending the Stations of the Cross, attending Mass, making a weekly holy hour before the Blessed Sacrament, taking time for personal prayer and spiritual reading and most especially making a good confession and receiving sacramental absolution. Although many Lenten practices may have evolved over the centuries, the focus remains the same: to repent of sin, to renew our faith and to prepare to celebrate joyfully the mysteries of our salvation through Jesus Christ.


