Brothers and Sisters,

With joy I announce to you that Fr. Chris Reising will become the next pastor of St. Anthony's Parish! I've known Fr. Reising for a long time and have had the privilege of calling him a friend. He is originally from St. Theresa Parish here in Des Moines and has family connections in Carroll County. Fr. Reising was ordained in 2006 and has served as pastor of Our Lady of the Americas on the east side, St. Patrick in Perry, and currently is at St. Bernard in Osceola. Fr. Reising is perfectly bilingual and has been a tremendous asset to our Diocese and the parishes he has served by bringing together both English and Spanish communities. Fr. Reising is orthodox, traditionally minded, and a good priest. He is an ideal fit for St. Anthony's. I hope you all welcome him with the same joy I have at knowing he is coming to serve you.

I promised more details about what I will be doing. My current "vacation" has been in part restorative from the end of Lent, the Triduum, and Easter. I have had a chance to make my annual retreat (which I normally make in January) which is required of us. However, it has also been to apply for a hospital residential chaplaincy program in Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE). The bishop has asked me to pursue this program with the hopes of attaining chaplaincy certification. On Tuesday last week, I had my first job interview in 16 years – and it was two hours long! Fortunately, it went well. So as of this August, I plan to spend one year in Clearwater, Florida in the Tampa Bay area working in the Morton Plant Hospital.

Finally, some of you may have heard that Msgr. Chiodo is in the hospital as a patient. This is true, but he asks and needs to not be disturbed at this time so that he can work on his health and, with the help of God, make a good recovery. Please continue to keep him in your prayers.

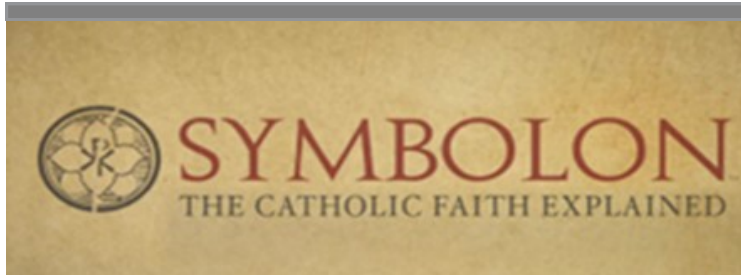

Did you know... we never ends to learn"?

Hello Blessed Day!

My pleasure to find you here! Last time we talked about prayer, and I mentioned that this time we were talking about ascetic life, but that will be next week. Today I would like to invite you to participate in our new program call **Symbolon, the catholic faith explained.**

What does **Symbolon** means? In the early Church, Christians described their Creed, their summary statement of faith, as the symbolon, the "seal" or "symbol of the faith." In the ancient world, the Greek word symbolon typically described an object like a piece of parchment, a seal, or a coin that was cut in half and given to two parties. It served as a means of recognition and confirmed a relationship between the two. When the halves of the symbolon were reassembled, the owner's identity was verified, and the relationship confirmed. In like manner, the Creed served as a means of Christian recognition. Someone who confessed the Creed could be identified as a true Christian. Moreover, they were assured that what they professed in the Creed brought them in unity with the faith the Apostles originally proclaimed. This series is called Symbolon because it intends to help bring people deeper into that communion of apostolic faith that has existed for 2,000 years in the Church that Christ founded.

In these ten sessions of Symbolon, participants will be led through the "big picture" of the Catholic faith, and the Creed will be their guide. The Leader, Participant's Guide, and video videos are the three components you'll be using for each of the Symbolon sessions. All three work together to enable the facilitator, small group leader, or catechist to help the participants to receive the Catholic faith and apply it to their everyday lives. We've found that when these resources are used along with your personal witness to the faith, all the participants grow together in knowledge of the Catholic faith and in relationship with our Lord. Journeying deeper into the Church becomes so much more than following a set of teachings or customs as lives are transformed by God's truth and grace..

EASTER MEDITATIONS

Topic: Feast of St. Joseph the Worker – May 1

In an effort to limit the evils of a growing worldwide communist worker movement, and to curb the unbridled greed of unrestrained capitalism, Pope Leo XIII expounded Catholic teaching that supports the true dignity of every worker: employee and employer alike.

“In order to impress upon men’s minds the dignity of human work and the principles according to which it should be carried on, Pius XII instituted the feast of St. Joseph the Workman that he might serve as model and aid to all workers. From his example, all who exercise various crafts or perform the various kinds of work should learn for what reason and in what spirit they are to earn their pay.

“Thus, while obeying the first command of God, to subdue the earth and to take care of their economic needs, they may at the same time gain the reward of eternal life. For he who took care of the Holy Family of Nazareth by his skill and labour will not fail to extend his protection to his coworkers and to bless them with dwellings in Heaven.

“Most appropriately, the Pope decreed that this feast should be celebrated on the first of May, the day which workers have adopted as their own. The choice gives high hope that this day, dedicated to St. Joseph the Workman, will henceforth no longer inflame hatred and incite dissensions, but, as it recurs yearly, will rather invite all to work ever more earnestly to provide what is still needed for civil peace. There is hope also that the recurrence of this feast will stimulate those in charge of the public welfare to concern themselves with the problems of the just order of human society.”
