Dear Friends,

We're getting a lot of requests for information about Msgr. Chiodo's condition.

Msgr. Chiodo is doing fairly well, considering. His condition has been diagnosed and a

treatment plan has been presented, which will soon lead to discharge from the hospital and likely admission to a skilled care facility. As you can imagine, Msgr. Chiodo is anxious and scared. He really does enjoy seeing all of your cards. Again, Msgr. Chiodo has requested privacy at this time. Please respect his privacy.

The Annual Diocesan Appeal (ADA) seems to have stagnated at 73% of goal - meaning we need about \$40,000 to fulfill our contribution. Money in this fund helps to pay for priest medical expenses, such as what Msgr. Chiodo is facing and will continue to face into retirement, as well as supplement our retired priests to be able to afford housing. Please contribute to the ADA, and make Fr. Reising's life easier when he gets here.

Those of you who have stopped by the parish office recently may have noticed a few changes. We're moving offices around, putting in new carpet, and painting the walls (not in that order!). We will also be doing some work in the rectory to refreshen the space for the priests coming to live here in July. Please pardon service interruptions recently, as computers and phones were getting moved around.

In the readings this weekend, the Church has us begin reflecting on the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Let us pray for a greater receptivity of the Holy Spirit in our lives as we seek to know, love, and follow the Lord Jesus every day.

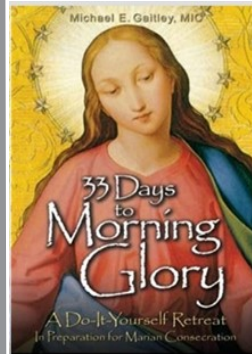

Hello everyone!

What is a consecration?

Consecration means “to make holy.” When one makes an act of consecration, it is made ultimately to God with the understanding that our consecration is a serious commitment on our part to respond faithfully to God’s grace at work in our lives.

When consecrating ourselves to Our Lady, we are consecrating ourselves to Jesus through Mary. As Pope John Paul II explained, “Consecrating ourselves to Mary means accepting her help to offer ourselves and the whole of mankind to him who is holy, infinitely holy; it means accepting her help—by having recourse to her motherly heart, which beneath the cross was opened to love for every human being, for the whole world—in order to offer the world, the individual human being, mankind as a whole, and all the nations to him who is infinitely holy” (May 13, 1982).

“Consecration to the Mother of God,” says Pope Pius XII, “is a total gift of self, for the whole of life and for all eternity; and a gift which is not a mere formality or sentimentality, but effectual, comprising the full intensity of the Christian life – Marian life.” This consecration, the Pope explained, “tends essentially to union with Jesus, under the guidance of Mary.”

Save the date, we'll start preparation on June 13 to consecrate yourself and consecrate our Parish on July 16 in the feast of Our Lady of the Mt Carmel.

CATECHISM MEDITATIONS

Topic: The Ascension of the Lord

661 This final stage stays closely linked to the first, that is, to His descent from heaven in the Incarnation. Only the one who “came from the Father” can return to the Father: Christ Jesus. “No one has ascended into heaven but He who descended from heaven, the Son of man.” Left to its own natural powers, humanity does not have access to the “Father’s house”, to God’s life and happiness. Only Christ can open to man such access that we, His members, might have confidence that we too shall go where He, our Head and our Source, has preceded us.

662 “And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself. “The lifting up of Jesus on the cross signifies and announces his lifting up by His Ascension into heaven, and indeed begins it. Jesus Christ, the one priest of the new and eternal Covenant, “entered, not into a sanctuary made by human hands. . . but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf.” There Christ permanently exercises His priesthood, for He “always lives to make intercession” for “those who draw near to God through Him”. As “high priest of the good things to come” He is the center and the principal actor of the liturgy that honors the Father in heaven.

Henceforth Christ is *seated at the right hand of the Father*: “By ‘the Father’s right hand’ we understand the glory and honor of divinity, where He who exists as Son of God before all ages, indeed as God, of one being with the Father...”
