On this Memorial Day weekend, we remember in a special way all of those men and women who have given their lives for our country and for the liberties we hold dear – especially to life and the freedom to pursue happiness.

This day always reminds me of how the Church remembers her heroes, especially the martyrs – those who gave witness to their faith and were killed for love of Christ. Memorial Day reminds us of all the people who have loved and sacrificed to bring us to where we are today. We have a debt of gratitude we owe them all.

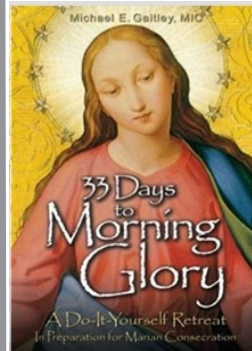

Hello everyone!

Why consecrate us and consecrate the Parish?

While there is a long history of consecration to Mary, the practice of consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary is closely linked to the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima. During the third apparition, on July 13, 1917, Our Lady said to the three little shepherds: "God wishes to establish the devotion to her Immaculate Heart in the world in order to save souls from hell and bring about world peace, and also asked for the consecration of Russia to her Immaculate Heart."

Pope Pius XII consecrated the Church and the entire world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on Oct. 31, 1942, as World War II continued to rage on. "To you, to your Immaculate Heart, in this tragic hour of human history, we confide our fortunes, putting ourselves in your hands," the Pope prayed.

John Paul II did the same on May 13, 1982, and again on March 25, 1984, at the conclusion of the Extraordinary Holy Year of the Redemption, in union with many of the bishops around the world. On Oct. 8, 2000, he made an act of entrustment of the world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary for the new millennium.

Between them, Pius XII and John Paul II consecrated the Church and the entire world to Mary a total of eight times. On Oct. 13, 2013, Pope Francis renewed the consecration of the world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary and dedicated his pontificate to Our Lady of Fatima and last March 25 he consecrate Russia.

The act of consecration to Mary "establishes a relationship of love with her in which we dedicate to her all that we have and are," says Saint John Paul II. "This consecration is practiced essentially by a life of grace, of purity, of prayer, of penance that is joined to the fulfillment of all the duties of a Christian, and of reparation for our sins and the sins of the world" (Sept. 26, 1986).

CATECHISM MEDITATIONS

Topic: The Ascension of the Lord

663 Henceforth Christ is *seated at the right hand of the Father*: "By 'the Father's right hand' we understand the glory and honor of divinity, where He who exists as Son of God before all ages, indeed as God, of One Being with the Father, is seated bodily after He became incarnate, and isH flesh was glorified."

664 Being seated at the Father's right hand signifies the inauguration of the Messiah's Kingdom, the fulfillment of the prophet Daniel's vision concerning the Son of man: "To him was given dominion and glory and kingdom, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve Him; His dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and His kingdom one that shall not be destroyed." After this event the apostles became witnesses of the "kingdom [that] will have no end".

670 Since the Ascension God's plan has entered into its fulfillment. We are already at "the last hour". "Already the final age of the world is with us, and the renewal of the world is irrevocably under way; it is even now anticipated in a certain real way, for the Church on earth is endowed already with a sanctity that is real but imperfect." Christ's kingdom already manifests its presence through the miraculous signs that attend its proclamation by the Church.
