Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Monday is the Solemnity of St. Anthony of Padua, patron saint of our parish. To celebrate, we will have a procession at noon today (Sunday) of the statue of St. Anthony from the church to the grotto, followed by festivities

and food.

St. Anthony was born in Lisbon, Portugal in 1135. He joined the Franciscan order and set sail to Morocco, but his boat was caught in a storm, and he ended up at Sicily. He went to Assisi to find St. Francis and, after the friars discovered his eloquent preaching, charged him with the formation of the friars. St. Anthony died in 1231 at Padua (today Padova). He is the patron saint of lost things.

Sunday the 19th, next Sunday, is Corpus Christi and as St. Anthony's tradition, we will have a Eucharistic procession through the neighborhood and end up back at the Grotto for the Pillar of the Parish award and lunch. Special thanks to our Hispanic brothers and sisters for hosting the lunch this year. Please see the Mass schedule for next Sunday. As we have done in the past, the 11am will be Bilingual and there will be no Spanish Mass at 1pm. I hope you will plan to attend.

Monsignor Chiodo continues treatment in the hospital. He is a little depressed (who wouldn't be?!) but endured treatment well. I take communion to him everyday, and Deacon Quan went up to give him a haircut. We hope he is discharged soon so he can do treatment as an outpatient. As it is, he appreciates your cards and prayers.

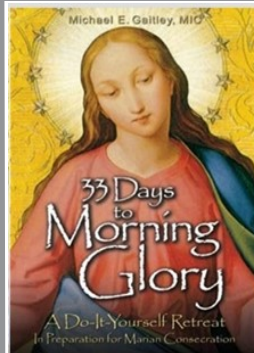

JUNE 13 is here, we're about to start our preparation for the consecration to Mary!

So for those who may not understand (yet) what a Marian consecration is, let me explain what it's all about. (This explanation, by the way, comes from Fr. Michael Gaitley, MIC.) Marian consecration basically means giving Mary our full permission (or as much permission as we can) to complete her motherly task in us, which is to form us into other Christs.

And so, by consecrating ourselves to Mary, each of us is saying to her: "Mary, I want to be a saint. I know that you also want me to be a saint and that it's your God-given mission to form me into one. So, Mary, at this moment, on this day, I freely choose to give you my full permission to do your work in me, with your Spouse, the Holy Spirit."

Program offers individuals a quick and easy way to withdraw from the demands of daily life and enter into a peaceful interior reflection on their relationship with Christ in the context of Marian devotion. We begin with the Immaculate Heart because Mary leads us to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The end result is that, by learning to entrust ourselves to the Mother of Our Lord, we can discover a transforming trust in Jesus himself.

CATECHISM MEDITATIONS

Topic: The Holy Spirit

685 To believe in the Holy Spirit is to profess that the Holy Spirit is one of the persons of the Holy Trinity, consubstantial with the Father and the Son: "with the Father and the Son He is worshipped and glorified."⁶ For this reason, the divine mystery of the Holy Spirit was already treated in the context of Trinitarian "theology." Here, however, we have to do with the Holy Spirit only in the divine "economy."

686 The Holy Spirit is at work with the Father and the Son from the beginning to the completion of the plan for our salvation. But in these "end times," ushered in by the Son's redeeming Incarnation, the Spirit is revealed and given, recognized and welcomed as a person. Now can this divine plan, accomplished in Christ, the firstborn and head of the new creation, be embodied in mankind by the outpouring of the Spirit: as the Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

687 "No one comprehends the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God." [1 Cor 2:11] Now God's Spirit, who reveals God, makes known to us Christ, His Word, His living Utterance, but the Spirit does not speak of Himself. The Spirit who "has spoken through the prophets" makes us hear the Father's Word, but we do not hear the Spirit himself. We know Him only in the movement by which He reveals the Word to us and disposes us to welcome Him in faith. The Spirit of truth who "unveils" Christ to us "will not speak on His own." [Jn. 16:13] Such properly divine self-effacement explains why "the world cannot receive [Him], because it neither sees Him nor knows Him," while those who believe in Christ know the Spirit because He dwells with them.

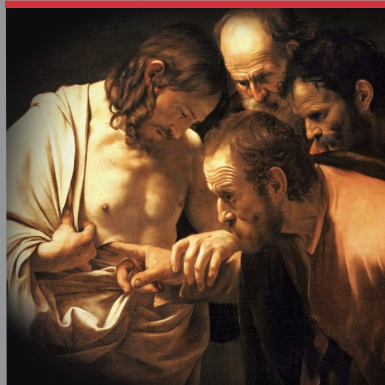
