

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR



In the Gospel weekend we see the meeting between Jesus and Zacchaeus. As a chief tax collector, he would have been looked upon as the worst of the worst of sinners by the Pharisees. The gospel makes the point of saying that he was short, which is to say he was low to the ground physically, but also conveys the sense of humility. St. Augustine gives us much to ponder on this encounter. He says it is the crowd that looks down upon those who try to live humbly; it is the crowd that scoffs those who do not get even with their enemies and calls them helpless, it is the crowd that prevents the individual from seeing Jesus.

Zacchaeus does something foolish, he climbs a tree to see Jesus. Can you imagine the sight of a short man in a tree, there just to see Jesus? Usually, children climb trees not grown men. He takes a risk of looking foolish. But again as St. Augustine says, he went above the crowd and was able to see Jesus. He climbed the sycamore tree, just as Jesus climbed the cross, and so he was able to see Jesus. It is in climbing the sycamore tree and taking the risk of looking foolish, that we see Jesus.

The result of the risk that Zacchaeus took was that Jesus saw him and went and had dinner with him. At this dinner, Zacchaeus says to Jesus that he will give half of what he has to the poor, and he will pay back four times anything that he extorted. Jesus replies that salvation has visited this house and that Zacchaeus is a true descendant of Abraham, he is righteous, in a right relationship with God, because of how he has responded to salvation; Christ visiting his house.

Like Zacchaeus, we need to climb the tree to see Christ. Sometimes we stand alone and look foolish, but it is in the response and act of faith that like him, we are made righteous by Christ. It is not always easy to live the faith, but in doing so we see, know, and love Christ present with us.

In our society, we need to take a stand for what is right, even if the rest of society does not side with us, or like Zacchaeus we will look the fool. Next Tuesday we have elections. As we chose who we want to rule us, we must first ask who does Christ want in these positions? We as Catholics are not one issue voters, we see all the issues, but some hold a higher weight than others. There are issues regarding finances, taxes, roads, immigration, housing, life, health care, education and many more. However, if one does not have life, there is no need for food, housing, education, healthcare, or any other issue, since these issues have been taken with the life that is taken through abortion. As Catholics, we cannot support the prochoice agenda or candidates who are prochoice in any way shape or form as it is contrary to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. If we look at the list of political issues and chose the issue, we want most, but the candidate that supports that issue is prochoice, we must ask ourselves, would I sacrifice a child or millions of children to have what I desire most?

May we like Zacchaeus have the courage to live our faith, and the courage to stand up for that faith even if it looks foolish to the world so that we may be true witnesses Jesus Christ in the world.

CARTA DEL PÁRROCO



En el fin de semana del Evangelio vemos el encuentro entre Jesús y Zaqueo. Como jefe de los recaudadores de impuestos, los fariseos lo habrían considerado como el peor de los peores pecadores. El evangelio insiste en decir que era bajito, lo que quiere decir que físicamente era bajo hasta el suelo, pero también transmite el sentido de humildad. San Agustín nos da mucho que reflexionar sobre este encuentro. Él dice que es la multitud la que menosprecia a los que tratan de vivir humildemente; es la multitud la que se burla de los que no se desquitán con sus enemigos y los llama impotentes, es la multitud la que impide al individuo ver a Jesús.

Zaqueo hace una tontería, se sube a un árbol para ver a Jesús. ¿Puedes imaginar la vista de un hombre bajo en un árbol, solo para ver a Jesús? Por lo general, los niños trepan a los árboles, no los adultos. Se arriesga a parecer tonto. Pero nuevamente, como dice San Agustín, pasó por encima de la multitud y pudo ver a Jesús. Se subió al árbol sicómoro, así como Jesús subió a la cruz, y así pudo ver a Jesús. Es al trepar al árbol sicómoro y correr el riesgo de parecer tonto, que vemos a Jesús.

El resultado del riesgo que corrió Zaqueo fue que Jesús lo vio y fue a cenar con él. En esta cena, Zaqueo le dice a Jesús que dará la mitad de lo que tiene a los pobres, y devolverá cuatro veces lo que extorsionó. Jesús responde que la salvación ha visitado esta casa y que Zaqueo es un verdadero descendiente de Abraham, es justo, esta en una relación correcta con Dios por cómo ha respondido a la salvación; Cristo visitando su casa.

Como Zaqueo, necesitamos subir al árbol para ver a Cristo. A veces nos paramos solos y hacemos el ridículo, pero es en la respuesta y el acto de fe que como él, somos hechos justos por Cristo. No siempre es fácil vivir la fe, pero al hacerlo vemos, conocemos y amamos a Cristo presente con nosotros.

En nuestra sociedad, debemos defender lo que es correcto, incluso si el resto de la sociedad no se pone de nuestro lado, o como Zaqueo quedaremos como tontos. El próximo martes tenemos elecciones. Al elegir a quién queremos que nos gobierne, primero debemos preguntarnos ¿a quién quiere Cristo en estos puestos? Nosotros, como católicos, no somos votantes de un solo tema, vemos todos los temas, pero algunos tienen un mayor peso que otros. Hay temas relacionados con las finanzas, los impuestos, las carreteras, la inmigración, la vivienda, la vida, la atención médica, la educación y muchos más. Sin embargo, si uno no tiene vida, no hay necesidad de comida, vivienda, educación, salud o cualquier otro tema, ya que estos temas se han tomado con la vida que se toma a través del aborto. Como católicos, no podemos apoyar la agenda a favor del derecho a elegir ni a los candidatos que están a favor del derecho a elegir de ninguna manera, ya que es contrario al Evangelio de Jesucristo. Si miramos la lista de temas políticos y elegimos el tema que más queremos, pero el candidato que apoya ese tema es pro elección, debemos preguntarnos, ¿sacrificaría un niño o millones de niños para tener lo que más deseó?

Que nosotros, como Zaqueo, tengamos el valor de vivir nuestra fe y el valor de defender esa fe, incluso si al mundo le parece una tontería, para poder ser verdaderos testigos de Jesucristo en el mundo.




