### Want to venture a little farther? Check out these iconic restaurants

#### [Casa Bonita](#)

This icon of Denver was purchased by the creators of "South Park," who dumped \$40 million into a renovation. Famous for its cliff divers and sopapillas, this is "the Disneyland of Mexican restaurants." Best thing on the menu? Anything, as the new chef, Dan Rodriguez, is a James Beard award-nominee!

#### [The Wolf's Tailor](#)

One of four newly recognized Michelin-star restaurants in the Front Range, this blend of Italian and Japanese food brings a unique taste to Colorado. It can be tricky to get a reservation with the increased demand, but the wait is worth it. Best thing on the menu? The Saguache valley trout garnished in chicharrón.

#### [The Buckhorn Exchange](#)

Now a National Historic Landmark, the original restaurant opened as the Rio Grande Exchange in 1893. There are more than 500 birds and animals in the Buckhorn's taxidermy collection. Best thing on the menu? Rocky Mountain Oysters!

#### [Sam's No. 3](#)

Featured in Guy Fieri's "Diners, Drive Ins, and Dives," this diner is 91 years old and still run by the family. Best thing on the menu? Spero's breakfast burrito, smothered in kickin' pork green chile!
