Warm Up

What is something (think beyond the obvious answers) that you are deeply passionate about?

Digging Deeper

Read Romans 6:1-14

Paul talks about dying with Christ in order that we might live with him. How would you go about explaining this idea to someone who has at most, a nominal understanding of what Christianity is?

Followers of Christ are not to use their bodies for unrighteous purposes. What are some other verses in the Bible that speak to this same idea?

What does Paul mean in verse 14 he says, "sin will have no dominion over you..."? We all still struggle with sin, right?

Read Romans 6:15-23

Paul makes an interesting statement in verses 17-18, when he says that by being free from sin, we become slaves of righteousness. What is the larger point Paul is trying to make?

What "fruit" do we see in our lives if we are committed to righteousness?

Next Steps

How does the world tempt you to stay committed to sin?

Who is someone in your life that is committed to righteousness and how do you know they have made this commitment?

With your family or friends, how do you seek to model righteousness?
