





John the Baptist expects the Messiah to bring God's judgment upon the earth (Matt. 3:11-12). From a prison cell, he wonders whether Jesus is the one who will do this. Jesus' response indicates that God's reign is indeed being fulfilled already through healing and restoration.

² When John heard in prison what the Messiah was doing, he sent word by his disciples ³ and said to him, "Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?" ⁴ Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: ⁵ the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, those with a skin disease are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have good news brought to them. ⁶ And blessed is anyone who takes no offense at me."

⁷ As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to look at? A reed shaken by the wind? ⁸ What, then, did you go out to see? Someone dressed in soft robes? Look, those who wear soft robes are in royal palaces. ⁹ What, then, did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. ¹⁰ This is the one about whom it is written,

'See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you,

who will prepare your way before you.'

¹¹ "Truly I tell you, among those born of women no one has arisen greater than John the Baptist, yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he."







Postlude: Louis Couperin (1626 - 1661), Chaconne in g-minor *

* **Prelude:** The set of 'eight short preludes and fugues' date to the period 1730–50 but for stylistic reasons are no longer judged to be the work of J.S. Bach himself. One of the hypothesis is that 'the eight' is likely to be by a student or students of Bach, the music of each piece being based upon an outline model, termed a 'partimento', that contains sufficient indications for the student to create a complete composition from it. The use of 'partimenti' was certainly a method by which Bach taught composition at the keyboard.

* **Postlude:** Louis Couperin was a French Baroque composer who made significant contributions to the development of Baroque keyboard music.
