First Reading

Acts 10:34-43

Peter crosses the immense religious and social boundary that separates Jews from Gentiles in order to proclaim the good news of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, so that God's forgiveness in Jesus' name would reach out to the Gentiles just as it had to Jews.

³⁴Then Peter began to speak to them: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ — he is Lord of all. ³⁷That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: ³⁸how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. ³⁹We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; ⁴⁰but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, ⁴¹not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. ⁴²He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

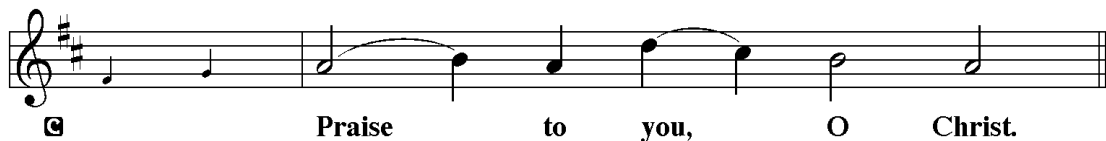
Matthew 28:1-10

Sorrow gives way to "fear and great joy" when two women are sent by an angel to proclaim the good news: Jesus is risen!

¹ After the Sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. ² And suddenly there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. ³ His appearance was like lightning and his clothing white as snow. ⁴ For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men. ⁵ But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. ⁶ He is not here, for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. ⁷ Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you."

*** Prelude:** Joseph Haydn (1732–1809) was a leading composer of the Classical period, often called the “Father of the Symphony” and “Father of the String Quartet” for his major role in shaping these forms. Known for his clarity, balance, and wit, he spent much of his career working for the Esterházy court and influenced composers like Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and Ludwig van Beethoven. His *Trumpet Concerto* in E-flat major (1796) was written for the newly developed keyed trumpet, which allowed for greater melodic flexibility than earlier natural trumpets.

* **Postlude:** Alan Hovhaness (1911–2000) was an American composer known for his deeply spiritual music, often inspired by Armenian heritage, Eastern traditions, and sacred themes. His style is characterized by modal melodies, rich harmonies, and a meditative, mystical atmosphere, setting him apart from many of his 20th-century contemporaries.

Prayer of Saint Gregory (1946), originally from his opera *Etchmiadzin*, is one of his most famous works. Frequently performed as a trumpet solo with orchestra or organ, the piece is slow, lyrical, and reverent, evoking a sense of solemn devotion. The trumpet line unfolds like a chant or prayer, expressing both intensity and serenity, and reflects Hovhaness’s interest in creating music as a form of spiritual expression.

DEDICATION INFORMATION

What a wonderful way to commemorate an occasion, celebrate a loved one or remember someone who has passed. Each week, you can dedicate the candles, flowers, or bulletins in honor or memory of a person(s). The dedication is then printed in the bulletin of the desired week, with the money from the dedication being used to support the purchase of liquid wax for the candles, paper for the bulletins, and flowers for the altar. In the case of the flowers, they can be taken home by the dedicator after the last service, or made available for the church to give to someone in need of encouragement (i.e., an at home member, someone in a care facility, someone in the hospital, etc.) **The cost for each dedication is \$6 for the candles; \$42 for two arrangements of flowers for the altar; \$21 for one arrangement of flowers for the altar; and \$13 for the bulletin.** A sign-up sheet is available in the narthex for the coming weeks, and [a dedication form](#) is also in the narthex to detail how you would like the dedication to be printed. 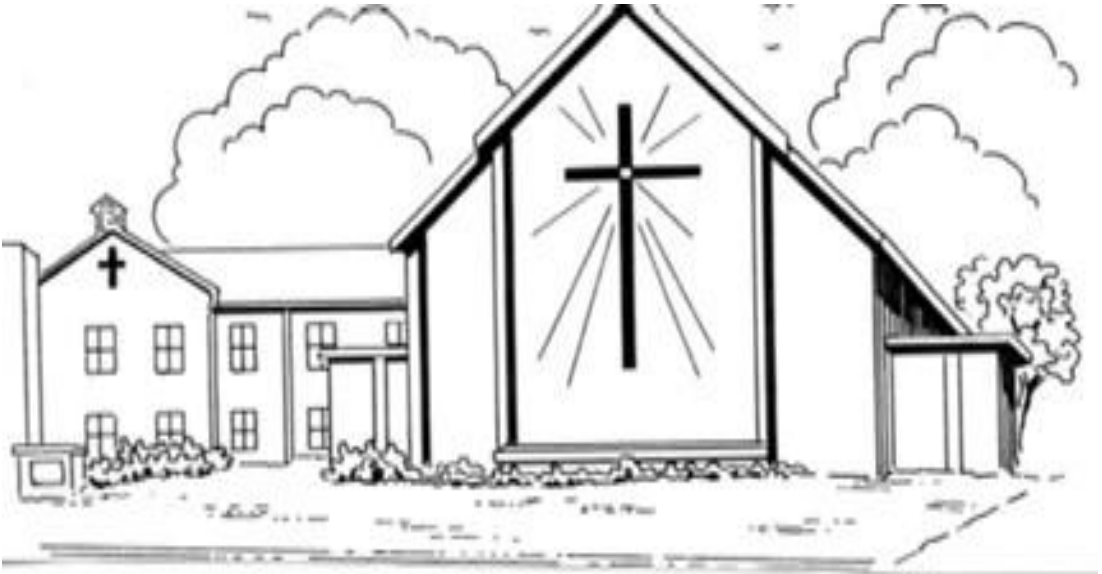
