
#### PARISH MEMBERSHIP

## Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St Denis.

Have you noticed the trend in our society of turning individual holi-days into week-long or month-long celebrations? For example, for the auto and the mattress industries, February has now become "Presidents' Month" because "Presidents' Day" happens to fall in the month of February. This month, with St Patrick's Day falling on a Sunday, Irish pubs and other restaurants and bars, are festooned with green shamrocks and leprechauns for the week before AND the week after March 17, turning St Patrick's Day into "St Patrick's Fortnight". (There's a good, old-fashioned word: fortnight.)

I am not one of those "professional Irishmen," although I have almost 100% Irish ancestry (with some Scottish and English thrown in). In college, I was a little more into my "Irishness" than I am now, serving as the Vice President of the "Irish Cultural Society" at the University of Virginia (basically a good excuse to get together and drink!) My father, Edward William Mulcahy, was very proud of his Irish roots, and when he retired from the Foreign Service, he took the time to teach himself modern Irish Gaelic. My dad had a real gift for languages. And when he died in 2006, I had the privilege of celebrating his Mass of Christian Burial on St Patrick's Day.

The ironic thing is that St Patrick himself wasn't particularly fond of the Irish people. He was from the Roman Province of Gaul (present-day France) and his exile to Ireland and his preaching the Gospel to the people of the island was considered a severe penitential act, a living martyrdom of sorts. But that did not prevent him from pouring himself out to bring the Irish people to faith in the living and true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. St Patrick became the Bishop of Armagh (in what is now Northern Ireland) around the year 444 AD, and to this day, the Archbishop of Armagh is regarded as the Successor of St Patrick and the Primate of All Ireland. The current Catholic Archbishop of Armagh is Eamon Martin.

The Catholic faith in Ireland has fallen upon hard times, mostly from self-inflicted wounds. But these ancient branches of the vine that might seem dead or dormant can surprise you with the new life they bring forth. St Patrick, pray for the people of Ireland for whom you spent your life! St Patrick, pray for us!



# HOW and the Children of the St. Denis Konditi School



St. Denis Konditi School (Pap-Onditi, Nyando District, Nyanza Province) is a public primary school that renamed itself in our honor! There in Kenya, a hard-working community member Daniel Ochiel, a PhD graduate of Geisel School of Medicine, and I-KODI, a local non-profit community self-help group

inspired by our friend Daniel, partner with the parishioners of St. Denis continue to support three vital projects. We support a cafeteria and daily lunch program, an orphan-feeding program (to provide nutritional assistance to extended families who have taken in orphaned children) as well as high school scholarships for graduates of the school's eighth grade.

#### **Lunchtime Feeding Program**

With generous donor support, we provide a hot meal at lunchtime for all students. Basic food staples such as rice, cooking oil and beans are purchased each month and prepared by two dedicated mothers in the community. The food is cooked in large kettles over an open fire and is then served to the children. Over 300 children now receive a simple, nutritious mid-day meal allowing them to return to the classroom better able to focus and learn. With the commitment of generous donors, we contribute to a hot lunch program that provides lunch five days per week for all students. This lunch is often the only meal of the day for these children.

### Food distribution to AIDS orphans

Working with I-KODI, we support 25 orphans. Every three months, these children and their caregivers, usually a grandparent or other relative, receive basic food supplies. We implemented this program in 2011 recognizing the ravages of the HIV epidemic and its impact on the most vulnerable. With your support, we hope to expand this program to provide much needed food to these children and their caregivers.

#### **High School Scholarship Program**

In 2015, with your generous help, we contributed to a scholarship program for promising students to attend regional and national high schools. In Kenya, the public school system provides education for children from kindergarten through the 8th grade. However, since high schools are tuition based, we have worked to provide students with financial support to cover all expenses for four years. We began with three students. As a direct result of your support, we have expanded this program to sponsor 12 students in high school for 2019, including talented and motivated girls. One of the hardest tasks we face is the limit of our resources to help every child to complete his or her education. With your help, we hope to expand this program in the year ahead. It is truly a donation that will change the course of a young person's life.

## Desks and Benches for Classrooms, Benches for Lunchroom and Crucifixes for Classrooms





In 2018, with donations from St. Denis, we purchased new desks and benches for all grades, and benches for the lunchroom at St. Denis Konditi School. St. Denis children raised money for crucifixes for the classrooms at the St. Denis Konditi School.



The tithe for the weekend offertory for the third and fourth weekend of March is set aside to support *Catholic Relief Services* (*CRS*). The CRS Collection supports Catholic Church organizations that carry out international relief and solidarity efforts. Funds from this collection provide food to the hungry, support displaced refugees, and bring Christ's love and mercy to all people here and abroad. In keeping with the theme "Help Jesus in Disguise," the collection helps six Catholic agencies provide relief and support to struggling communities and work for peace and reconciliation among our marginalized brothers and sisters here and around the world Please prayerfully consider how you can support the collection. Example: \$25. Within a few minutes, you'll be sent a text with a link to register. Click on the link and enter your cardholder name and credit or debit card information. Once your registration is complete, you will receive a text verification and a receipt via email. For future giving, simply send a text with the amount you wish to give, and it will process automatically!


