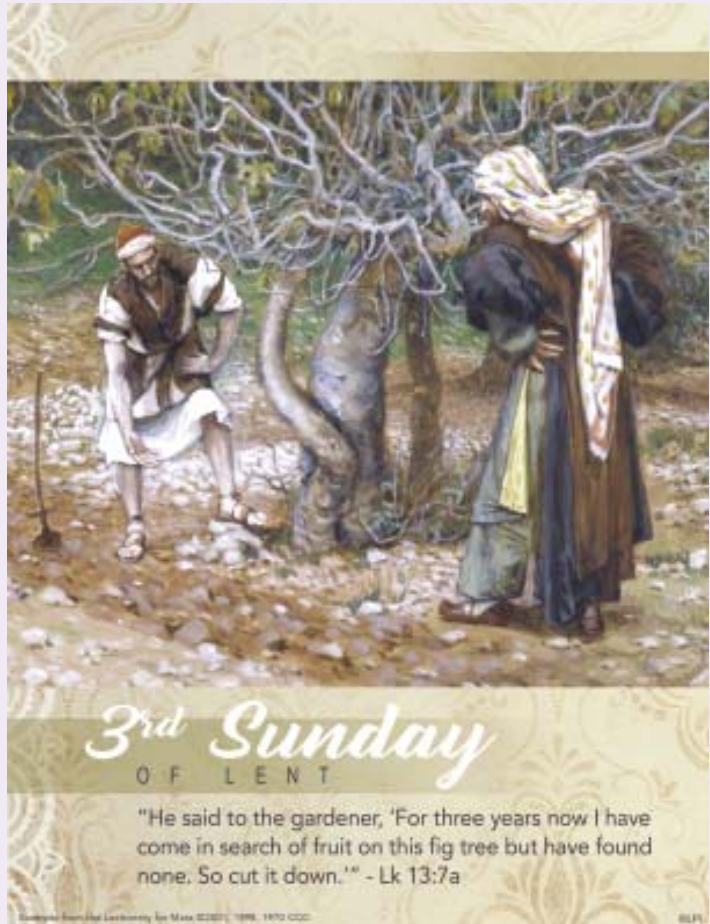
PARISH MEMBERSHIP

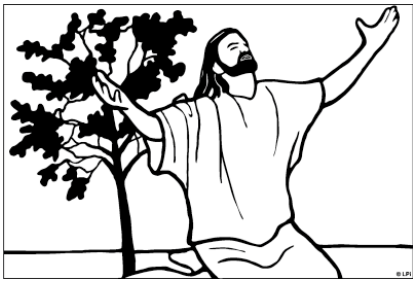
MARRIAGE: Engaged couples must contact the parish office at least six months in advance of scheduling a wedding.

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St Denis,

This Monday, March 25th, is the Solemnity of the Annunciation of our Lord, when the Archangel Gabriel appeared to the Blessed Virgin Mary in her hometown of Nazareth to tell her that she was to be the mother of God's only-begotten Son, to whom she was to give the name, Jesus. We commemorate this momentous event in our salvation history on March 25th because it is exactly nine months before our celebration of Christmas. As the moms in the parish would know, it is the very rare baby who is born nine months to the day after the child was conceived! Nevertheless, the Church has commemorated the Incarnation of the Son of God in the womb of His Mother, Mary, on this date for centuries, while acknowledging that we don't know the exact date it happened.

When we were on pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 2018, on our first full day there, we celebrated our first Mass of the pilgrimage together in the Basilica of the Annunciation in Nazareth, a very fitting place to begin our journey to the holy sites associated with our Lord's life, death, and resurrection. The current Basilica in Nazareth is very modern, completed only in 1969 when Paul VI was Pope. However, the current church is built over the Grotto of the Annunciation, which marks the spot of our Blessed Mother's family home. On the front of the altar in the grotto are inscribed in Latin the words "*Et Verbum caro hic factum est,*" which, of course, is a quote from the Prologue of St John's Gospel, "And the Word was made Flesh," (Jn 1:14) with the addition of one little but powerful word, "hic" or "here," as in, "And the Word was made Flesh **here.**"

I remember the first time I had a chance to pray before the Grotto of the Annunciation, that reading those words gave me goosebumps (but in a good sense) all over my body, that, on this very spot, God entered into our human history, through the consent of a young Jewish girl from this town of Nazareth, thereby changing all of human history. I was bowled over by the "concrete-ness," the particularity, of it all.

One last liturgical bit of trivia: the Solemnity of the Annunciation is one of two days on our liturgical calendar (the other day being Christmas) when, in Professing our Faith at Mass, we don't simply bow our heads at the mention of the mystery of the Incarnation -- *...and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man* -- but instead we bend our knees.

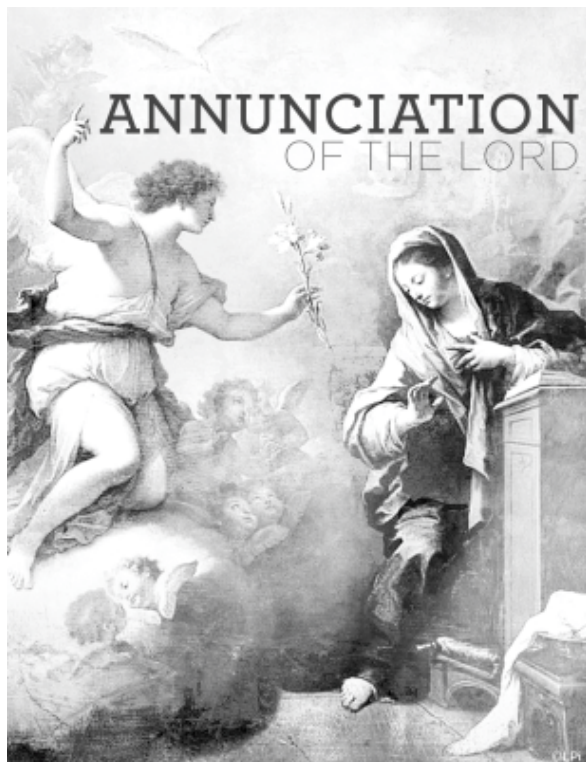

HOW and our Nyakach Hospital Partners

Overview of health facilities in Western Kenya

Nyakach District Hospital in Pap-Onditi is located in Kisumu County in the western region of the country. The hospital, which serves a population of about 45,000 people, has only one medical doctor, Dr. Anifill Agwanda, Medical Superintendent, in charge of the facility. In addition to its one physician, the Nyakach Hospital staff comprises 13 clinical nurses; seven clinical officers (similar to a physician assistant); two pharmacists, one occupational therapist and one physical therapist. Through clinic visits about 22,000 outpatients are treated each year; of those 6,000 are individuals with HIV.

Kisumu is the epicenter of HIV in Kenya. HIV care (which is administered free) and treatment services, curative in-patient services and outpatient services are some of the services offered at the hospital.

The hospital's inpatient capacity is 10 pediatric beds, eight women's ward beds, and 10 men's ward beds; also 10 in maternity with eight in labor and delivery. The hospital services include x-ray facilities and a lab to screen blood. It also has a community outreach program.

We are happy to say that with the departure of Dr. Albert Odhiambo Ngonga, the former Director of the Nyakach Hospital with whom we worked to provide water to the hospital, we now have an excellent relationship with Dr. Anifill Agwanda who has replaced Dr. Albert.

Dr Agwanda sends his thanks:

"I hope you passed our profound gratitude for the bottomless gift of water. We've become an oasis in the desert especially in this period when it's very dry with no rains. It's a season of droughts (runs Dec-End March) here! We no longer have the costly and tiresome trips to a distant Hydro-Electric Power headquarters (Sondu station) to get water in 20-liter containers. Thanks a bunch our ever dependable friends. Asante!"

We saw, we learned, we shared

It is through St Denis's generosity that the hospital now has running water. The major project for 2017-2018 was the successful drilling of a borehole that pumps ample water to the hospital, laboratory, laundry, kitchen, sinks and the local community (video on the St Denis web site). For 2019, we have identified an equally ambitious project, the construction of five bathroom facilities: three with flush toilets lavatory, sinks and showers for patients plus two with flush toilets and sinks for hospital staff. Once we confirm the functioning of the existing septic system, plans are underway to receive competitive bids for this project, just as we did for the borehole project.

At present, patients use pit latrines and have minimal hand washing stations. This improvement in sanitary conditions will help all patients, both young and old, mothers-to-be and their newborns as well as healthcare workers.

We recognize that safety and hygiene go together and are excited about our plan to provide sanitary conditions and good hygiene for all at the hospital. We thank you for your wonderful generosity in the past and ask for your assistance as we work with our colleagues at Nykach County Hospital to complete this much needed improvement that will be life changing for many.
