Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St Denis,

This Fourth Sunday of Lent, we celebrate as *Laetare Sunday*, from the opening words of the traditional Introit of the Mass, "*Laetare, Ierusalem, et conventum facite, omnes qui diligitis eam.*.", "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and be glad for her, you who love her...", taken from the 66th chapter of the Prophet Isaiah, and it's one of the two Sundays of the liturgical year when rose vestments are permitted (not required.)

The origins of Laetare Sunday are to be found in the fact that the <u>Thursday before the Fourth Sunday of Lent</u> is the mid-point of the forty days of Lent, and in the days when the Lenten fasting required of Christians was much more strict than it is now, the mid-point of Lent became a day of encouragement for the faithful that they had made it half-way through the season of penitence and fasting. The faithful were encouraged to ease up on their fasting on that day. Later, the special signs of joy permitted on the mid-point day, intended to encourage the faithful in their course through the season of penance, were transferred to the Sunday following.

And this year, when we have for our Gospel the Parable of the Prodigal Son, it seems very fitting for Laetare Sunday, since the father in the parable rejoices on the return of his younger son and says to his older son, "now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found.""

So, rejoice, brothers and sisters, you've made it halfway through Lent! The joy of the Resurrection and the Easter Season will be upon us before you know it!





OUTREACH



Sunday morning at Christ the King Church, Katito, western Kenya

Like a flash-flood in slow motion, the parishioners, hundreds of them, stream toward the big new church in the distance. Many families had set out on foot from their homes in the hills soon after dawn. Now, an hour later, mothers, children, and *wazee* (old folks) pick their way along rutted tracks across the red-clay plain of Katito, dressed for church, unfazed by the dust and the early heat of the day.



Soon, the new parish church of Christ the King is packed -- a half-hour before Mass even begins. Inside, the church is high and airy and cool, morning light filtering through perforations in the clerestory walls. There's a quiet shuffle and buzz 600 as parishioners exchange greetings and settle in.

Yet the huge volume of the grand space above creates a light and peaceful calm over all of us.

I look around me. I know these folks. This is my eighth year of attending Mass with the people of Christ the King Church in Katito. We've worshiped together in all manner of makeshift settings and structures, from open-air tents to converted farm buildings. Today, in this new church that they've built together, their faces seem to me to reflect a benign sense of satisfaction and pride. These are the "*Yes, we can*" people, Luo people, proud relatives of the 44th president of my own country. At heart, we are brothers and sisters.

Soon the choir begins the entrance hymn (in Swahili) and a congaline of parish girls and boys (all in bright-yellow "Christ the King, Katito" tee-shirts) dances and shimmies up the aisle toward the altar. Some of the older boys wear traditional face-masks (at outdoor services, they walk on stilts, as well), carry hand-made shields, and shake ceremonial wooden staffs.

All this goes on for about ten minutes, as the pastor, Fr. Alfred Atemo, avuncular and thin as a rail, looks on from the altar. His face is impassive, but I sense that he feels enormous pride and joy in what his parish and he have accomplished together in building this spectacular new church.

In its sheer scale and vision and courage, the new Christ the King church is heroic. It stands tall and robust on its flat and parched terrain, like a medieval European cathedral, the tallest feature in the landscape, beckoning the faithful from afar: here is peace, here is Christ the King. This is a church conceived by a visionary but humble pastor, Fr. Alfred, a man of unswerving patience and faith, and funded by the scrimping and saving of the parishioners of Christ the King – and with help from the people of St. Denis.

Eight years ago, a group of us from St. Denis first visited Katito, a dirt-poor settlement in rural western Kenya, to see an altar there which, a few years before, we'd been asked to fund "for a new church." Sure enough, we found the altar -- handsome and heavy, sitting outdoors in the weeds, waiting for a church -- parked near the privy that serves the priest's house, in the middle of pretty-much-nowhere. That priest was Fr. Alfred Atemo.



Fr. Alfred shared with us his vision: a grand new church to bring together his parish, mostly subsistence farmers, at that time served in eight little chapels scattered across an area twice the size of Hanover and Norwich put

together. He showed us the drawings: the new church Fr. Alfred and his Parish Council wanted to build was huge, implausible. Nonetheless, next day, still shaking our heads at the audacity of it all, we joined a ceremonial ground-breaking. Then and there we promised the help of St. Denis parish.

That was seven years ago, and you, the people of St. Denis, have come through, contributing tens of thousands in support of building the new Christ the King church in Katito. Fr. Alfred and the people of Christ the King are deeply grateful for your kindness and generosity.

To me, the people of Christ the King are my sisters and brothers. To them, all of us, the people of St. Denis, are *their* sisters and brothers!
