Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St Denis,

With the Fifth Sunday of Lent, we enter into what the Church has called "Passiontide," the most solemn time of year on our liturgical calendar, as we annually commemorate the great events of our Lord's Passion, Death and Resurrection that won for us our salvation. The readings at Mass all during this Fifth Week of Lent tell of the rising conflict between Jesus and the religious and political authorities of the day that would lead to His arrest and condemnation to death on a Cross.

This year, the local school holiday coincides with Holy Week, so I realize that many of our families will be away from St Denis during that time. But, if you and your family are staying around during Holy Week, and if it's been awhile since you and your family have taken part in the liturgies of Holy Week, which begins next Sunday with Palm (or Passion) Sunday, and which include the Sacred Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night, I want to urge you to consider being here with your brothers and sisters in Christ at St Denis for these most solemn celebrations of our Christian faith. Here at St Denis, for the benefit of our working families, on Holy Thursday and on Good Friday, April 18th and April 19th, the Liturgy of each day will begin at 7:00 pm. The Great Vigil of Easter, which has to begin in darkness, will be celebrated at 9:00 pm (because Easter is so late this year) on Holy Saturday, April 20th, with the lighting and blessing of the New Fire.

Of course, on Easter Sunday, April 21st, we will have the Mass of Easter Morning at our usual times, 9:00 am and 11:30 am. You will find more information about our Holy Week services here at St Denis elsewhere in this bulletin. May every grace and blessing of Passiontide be with you and your families!

HOW

Our Lady of Grace School

Hearts Open to the World has a special relationship with the 220 orphaned and vulnerable children at Our Lady of Grace School in Kisumu, Kenya. This Dominican-founded school educates children ranging in age from three to thirteen, and every single one of these children loves YOU. They know that in the last year you made possible the ceramic tile on their formerly dirt floors, the new wooden desks they are so proud of, the crucifixes on their classroom walls, the books in their classroom, and that each month you help to nourish them in mind and body with a generous donation to operating expenses. The children in this pre-K to eighth grade school are praying for YOU.



Here's the background: In 2008, at a time of great political violence, Dominicans in western Kenya sought to protect local children from harm. Each day, children from rival ethnic groups were threatened as they walked long distances to their public schools. Some families chose not to send their children to school because of the risk. **Our Lady of Grace School was founded as a refuge for these at-risk children.** Here, they would be provided with a home, meals, and education.

In the past decade, the country's political violence has quieted, and orphanages have been able to assist with shelter, but Our Lady of Grace School remains a beacon of hope for children who lack the basics, and have lost parents to violence or disease--particularly to HIV/AIDS. Kisumu is the epicenter for AIDS in Kenya, with nearly 25% of the population afflicted. Half of the region's children have lost one or both parents. In addition, the devastating drought of the past four years in Kenya means that many children suffer hunger daily.

Under the leadership of Maria Oguom Casiraghi, who has twice visited us at St. Denis, Our Lady of Grace offers a **quality education and two meals a day** to these needy and vulnerable children--kids who would otherwise not BE in school. Meeting the needs of the whole child -- body, mind, spirit, and soul—is Maria's daily concern. "The children served at OLG have usually suffered different kinds of trauma," she says: "death of parents or a parent, living with un-caring extended family members, rejection, and sometimes, sexual abuse."

But looking at the smiling faces at Our Lady of Grace, you would not know. The children are being well-educated. This school has performed in the top three of eighteen schools in their district for the past three years. Hungry minds, bodies, and spirits are being fed. 80% of the students at OLG will eat no dinner at night, but they have had a hearty breakfast and lunch at school, and thrive there. They



also experience the love of God there. Maria writes: "We are dedicated to teaching the children the word of God and helping them experience the love of God in their lives, treating them with love and dignity, which is not often found in public schools."

We at Hearts Open to the World became connected with Our Lady of Grace through the Dominicans and through our work in western Kenya. We've built a cafeteria, fixed the roof, and funded electricity in the classrooms. Last year we purchased new desks, crucifixes and flooring, but mostly, we help with operating expenses (nearly a quarter of their budget). This year, we are again asking for your help for operating expenses and key new capital projects. The entire pre-school facility (three classrooms) is being rebuilt after having been condemned by the Kenyan ministry. That's a big project, and we're on it with a fundraising goal of \$25,000.

Pope Francis has written: "We will be asked ... if we have helped to overcome the ignorance in which millions of people live, especially children deprived of the necessary means to free them from the bonds of poverty." (Miserecordiae Vultus, 2015). Year after year, you have through your ongoing support. "Sow a character, reap a destiny," is the motto of Our Lady of Grace School. We thank you for *your* character and the seeds you've sown over the years, helping Maria and the children reap a brighter future for Kenya.



Pope Francis has asked our parish to support the **Pontifical Good Friday Collection**, which helps Christians in the Holy Land. Your support helps the church minister in parishes, provide Catholic schools and offer religious education. The Pontifical Good Friday Collection also helps to preserve the sacred shrines. In order for donation records to be complete, make sure that you are registered and that your donation is in an envelope with your full name and the amount on it.
