Psalm 98:1-9

# Stanza 1 - (Verses 1-3)

The Psalmist is telling us is that we need to sing praises to God because of the things He has done in our past and the things he is doing in <u>our present</u> lives.

A great example for us this time of year is Mary the mother of Jesus

#### Luke 1:46-55

<u>David-</u> Sing to the LORD a new song

Mary - My soul glorifies/praises the Lord.

<u>David</u> -For He has done marvelous things

Mary - He has performed mighty deeds with his arm

<u>David</u> - He has remembered his love and his faithfulness to the house of Israel

Mary - He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful.

We also must remember that God is the <u>same</u> today as he was when David wrote this Psalm, loving and faithful, with the power to save.

# Stanza 2 – (Verses 4-6)

It doesn't matter if you make music with an instrument or with your voice, it doesn't say what kind or type of music to make, but David does tell us *how* we are to make music, **joyfully**.

So how do we make sure we are joyfully praising God?

By taking the focus off of us and putting it back on to God.

### Stanza 3 - (Verses 7-9)

David personifies the sea, the world, the rivers, and the mountains giving them the ability to **praise God**.
