- 1) When was the last time you stood for 6 hours, by choice, for anything? Cedar Point, a game, concert, Black Friday
- 2) Do we treat the reading & preaching of the Word of God in the same way that the people in Jerusalem did in Nehemiah 8? Why or why not?
- 3) Do you agree that because we hear the Bible so often today, that we can become dulled to its words and immune to its teachings? How can we protect against this?
- 4) Why do you think the presence of all the Levites were important when Ezra read from the Book of the Law and gave the sense? Is this equally important today with our elders?
- 5) Has the reading of God's word ever caused you to weep? Why is both weeping and celebration appropriate responses to the reading of God's Word?
- 6) What formula did the Protestant Reformation of the 16<sup>th</sup> Century, the Great Awakening of the 18<sup>th</sup> Century and the events in Nehemiah 8 all share?
- 7) What part of the formula do you think the "Church" of today is lacking the most?
- 8) Which of the 7 things we can learn from the spiritual awaking in Nehemiah 8 (see the sermon outline) stuck out most to you?
- 9) What are some practical ways we can be a part of a spiritual awakening movement today?

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
