The surgeon removed the biggest polyp and several others, and decided that they will go back in 6 months later to get the rest. She thanks everyone for your prayers and was feeling quite well last night. Please pray for good biopsy results for the polyps that they took out and that they can find out what is causing them.

On March 22, Kelly Rhue is scheduled to have outpatient surgery on her wrist to remove a cyst. She currently has a cold/sinus thing that she can not seem to shake. If she still has this by next Tuesday, she will need to reschedule the surgery. She has already rescheduled once due to a work conflict, and would really like to get this surgery done (she scheduled it this time so that she could recuperate during Spring Break). So any prayers for would be appreciated.

Please continue to pray for Sarah Wenzel (Schneider)& family. Sarah has scheduled her surgery with Dr. Ballinger (mastectomy) and Dr. Wendell (reconstruction). The surgery will be on April 12th at Centennial Hospital in Nashville. Mastectomy followed by Latissimus Dorsi Flap Reconstruction. Chemotherapy will follow after she has had time to heal. Additional reconstruction happens after chemo is completed.
