So the tough question for us all this morning is "How do I react when things aren't going fairly?"

Acts 6:1-15

Story #1, The disciples react to a problem

- 1. The problem arises because of all of the growth that has taken place.
 - a. When growth happens, and leaders try to do everything themselves, things get <u>missed</u>.
- 2. This could have been a huge problem, but instead of letting the problem grow the disciples acted quickly and decisively.
- 3. They couldn't do everything, so they decided to focus on what God had called them to do which was the ministry of the <u>Word of God</u>.
- 4. Some amazing things happened
 - a. No job is better or more important than another.
 - b. A miracle occurred.

What can we learn from this story?

- Don't look at a problem as only a bad thing, but as an <u>opportunity</u>.
- The job you are called to do, is what you need to be doing.
- We need to be people who are full of the Spirit and of wisdom.
 - a. How do we do that? Through <u>prayer and Bible</u> reading.

Story #2, Stephen reacts to being treated unfairly

- 1. The story starts out with a success story, Stephen who was one of the chosen in the first story did great signs and wonders and was full of the <u>Spirit and of Power</u>.
- 2. People tried to speak out against Stephen, but when they couldn't beat him in a debate, they cheated.
- They brought Stephen before the Sanhedrin, and he couldn't do much because he was a Greek speaking Jew not from Jerusalem.
 - a. But he could do one thing, he controlled his reaction.

What can we learn from this story?

- Life is not always fair, even if we follow God <u>correctly.</u>
- Make sure that we are not doing to anyone else, what the Jews did to Stephen.
 - Heidelberg Catechism 112 ""That I never give false testimony against anyone, twist no one's words, not gossip or slander, nor join in condemning anyone rashly or without a hearing."

Challenges:

- 1. Look at <u>problems</u> as opportunities this week.
- 2. Make sure that you know what God has called you to do in this season of your life and make sure that you are doing that <u>well</u>.
- 3. When things happen to you that aren't fair, let us react full of the Spirit of God and not full of sin.

I hope that God's word today has shown us all that even if life is unfair, that doesn't mean that God doesn't love us or that he has <u>abandoned</u> us, it just means that we have an opportunity to show how much God loves us to others.
