- 7) According to the sermon, work is not simply a means of acquiring stuff, it is _____. How does that differ from how the majority of the world views it?
- 8) Have you ever seen an “ant” at work? What did you observed? What can we learn from the “ant”?
- 9) Of the 3 “lessons from a bug” shared in the sermon, which one was most impacting to you? Why?
- 10) How does the book of Proverbs describe “the ant” verses “the sluggard”? Which one best represents you on a daily basis?
- 11) What practical wisdom from this sermon can you apply to your life this week?

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
