**Who Is BRC?** We are a member of the Reformed Church in America, a Protestant denomination that goes back to the Reformation period in Europe when the Church was "reformed" according to the Word of God.

We are a mixture of Christians from many denominational backgrounds, all seeking to grow in our spiritual maturity as we live by faith with Jesus as our forgiver and leader.

- **Medical boat doctor-**\$250-Three medical mission boats serve as outpatient clinics along the Amazon River, providing medical care to many people who do not have adequate healthcare. Your gift helps provide a doctor on a medical mission boat for one month.
- **Cow**-\$500-Dairy cows produce up to four gallons of milk per day! With that much milk, families can improve their nutrition and earn extra income.
- Chickens-\$25-Chickens require little space, and a family can eat their eggs and meat or sell them at the market.
- **Goat**-\$60-Goats are a great source of milk, cheese, butter, and yogurt, which can be eaten or sold. Your gift also covers vet care.
- School scholarship-\$50-Many children around the world do not have access to education because of a lack of financial resources. Your gift covers school supplies, tuition, and other educational necessities.
- Leadership and missionary training-\$250-Indigenous leaders can make a great impact for God's kingdom within their communities. Your gift makes it possible for leaders to get the training they need to nurture the local church and to share the gospel with the unreached like those in Amazon, Brazil.
- Seeds and tools-\$60-Because fruits and vegetables are expensive, the typical diet in rural Nicaragua consists of rice, beans, plantains, and tortillas. Your gift supplies a woman with seeds for produce like squash, melons, carrots, and cucumbers. She will also receive training to manage her gardens and will attend cooking classes.
- Feed a child-\$50-Many children in Bluefields, Nicaragua, are living in poverty with limited access to nutritious meals and health care. Your gift feeds one child for one year through the Healthy Child Program. This program holistically supports children by providing nutrition and medical care as they work their way through school. Your gift also provides courses for parents to learn about sustainable food sources.
- Help a child in crisis-\$83-Unemployment, poverty, and healthrelated stresses in Botshabelo, South Africa, make parenting more difficult and can lead to child abuse and abandonment. Your gift provides for the medical, nutritional, and educational needs of a child for one month. During this month, Setshabelo Family and Child Services works to improve the child's situation.
- Support a foster family-\$100-A family in Botshabelo can foster an orphaned child while Setshabelo Family and Child Services finds a permanent, loving, adoptive home for the child. Many families are eager to foster but cannot afford it. Your gift provides a foster or adoptive family with a support kit, which covers expenses like groceries and medical care.

# **Gift options:**

- Clean water -\$100-Lack of clean water is a leading cause of disease and poor health for children in impoverished areas. Your gift ensures that children have access to clean water through wells and water purifiers.
- Water roller -\$140-Water is heavy! Water rollers help women and girls in remote villages transport ten times as much water as they could carry on their heads. .
- **Food** -\$80-People around the world suffer from hunger and struggle to grow sufficient crops to feed their families. Your gift provides food for a community and supports sustainable agriculture and food security.
- **Refugee meals**-\$50-There are 65 million people in the world who identify as refugees today. Your gift provides a food pack of tea, biscuits, rice, tomato paste, lentils, chickpeas, and other items for a refugee family to eat for a month.
- Sewing machine-\$175-Through a tailoring program in India, mothers living below the poverty line are equipped to start their own home-based businesses. Upon graduation, each woman receives a sewing machine and five years of mentoring.
- **Medical care**-\$100-Without adequate supplies, medical clinics cannot meet their patients' needs. Your gift provides life-saving medical care and immunizations.
